## Hurd The Word

*From the Revd. Alun Hurd*

History tells us that there are and were a great many women and men who have made a significant and world-changing contribution to the lives of us mere mortals, for both good and bad. It wouldn't take much to reel off the names of the obvious candidates who may fit the bill. I hesitate to offer any suggestions simply because I might miss your favourites or mention contentious names.

In recent months a lot has been written and said about many of the statues, plaques and commemorative descriptions of some of those who in the past were lauded as somehow worthy of recognition or praise. Again, you may be aware of some aspects of this debate particularly in relation to some 'famous' people who were involved in the slave trade, yet occupy a place in history, not least because they brought wealth and economic prosperity to this country and benefited others despite that iniquity of trading in human beings. Or they were prime examples of a 'Great Britain' in an imperialist age when God was probably an 'Englishman' spreading the virtues of a white Victorian, "we know best" culture and influence.

Perhaps our heroes of yesterday did have feet of clay and were products of their age and are now somewhat diminished looking through 21<sup>st</sup> century eyes, values and analysis.

Nonetheless there are around us, I would suggest, people who we can take inspiration from while understanding the limits of perfection we live within ourselves.

As I write it is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of Nelson Mandela, the terrorist and prisoner turned nation builder of South Africa who died in 2013. Out of a struggle for equality

for the black and 'coloured' population in a deeply unequal apartheid society, he endured 27 years in prison. There he formulated a personal Christian-based approach to life and a view of a society that could and should co-exist in a peaceful way. There is not space here to do justice to him or his legacy, not always universally accepted or appreciated, but we can say, even though the nation left behind after his death, with its obvious difficulties, was given a beacon of light and hope. For many all over the world Mandela has stood for freedom and a remarkable attitude regarding forgiveness to those who would have killed him and beat him down.

Likewise, as Christians, I and many others look to our example of divine humanity and perfection as we perceive him, in the person of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. We have his teaching, his life and most importantly the love he demonstrated by dying on the cross for our sins, to express God the Father's hope that we may all have eternal life because we are precious and loved by him.

I and the church are imperfect as all of us are, but we strive for perfection to tread in the footsteps of Jesus who shows us the way as no other can.

I hope and pray that you have good influences and role models in your life and can see and feel the positive things they can bring.

Jesus says "Come to me you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest .... for I am gentle in heart and you will find rest for your souls" (*Matthew 11: 28-29*).

His offer can change your life and he doesn't have feet of clay - think about it.

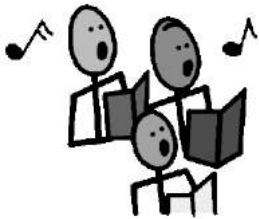

**Digging for Britons!  
Community Excavations in the  
Lune Gorge**

Lunesdale Archaeology Society (LAS) has been awarded a Heritage Lottery Fund grant to investigate a prehistoric settlement site just south of the known Roman fort at Low Borrowbridge in the Lune Gorge. The investigations will be conducted over the next two years and will offer an opportunity for volunteers to learn about archaeological techniques while revealing something of the lives of ordinary people at the time of the Roman occupation. The site on farming land in the Lune Gorge was discovered through aerial photography in the 1970s, surveyed in the 1990s, but has not otherwise been examined before.

Jan Hicks of LAS commented: "It is fantastic to be able to examine this intriguing settlement site in detail over a two year period thanks to National Lottery players. We know that the Roman fort, half a mile to the north, was occupied throughout the Roman period (from around 70AD to at least 350AD) but we know little about how the soldiers stationed there interacted with the local population, where their food came from and how they spent their wages. And we know very little about the locals, how they lived, farmed and went about their daily lives. The study will enable local volunteers to get involved in answering some of these questions. With the help of experts we will be running workshops in archaeological techniques, such as surveying, excavating and analysing/dating finds so that those with no prior archaeological experience can play a part".

In true 'Time Team' style the work will begin with 'geophysics' – geophysical surveys that allow us to identify remains below ground that may not be visible above but could be of archaeological significance. These surveys will help us to locate targets for excavation later this year and early next. LAS will be recruiting volunteers of all abilities to help with aspects of the study. Some may be keen to get down and dirty excavating in the trenches, while others may prefer to help with cleaning, sorting and identifying the finds.

## Year 6 community Art Project

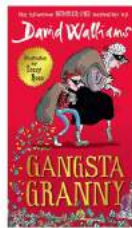

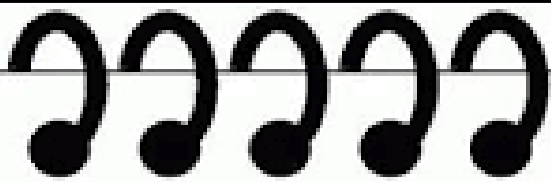

Dear Rev Chris

Am glad to write to you as I send Christian love to you and the Christians of Orton Church.

In Kasese we are OK, adjusting from a wet and rainy season to a hot and dry period.

We had a parish council as indicated to you. The Council resolved that we buy part of the open free land in front of the church to enable us have space to plan for staff accommodation, Sunday School church and a commercial house.

We have decided to acquire a loan from the bank which we should pay back in 5 years at a rate of 7.3 million Shillings (*about £1,450*) every month. This shall require each Christian to give at least 5000shs (*about £1*) every Sunday. We launched this programme last Sunday. We need your prayers for the success of this activity.

I wish you God's blessings and love to all the brethren.

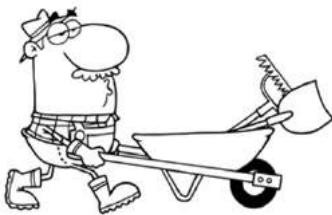

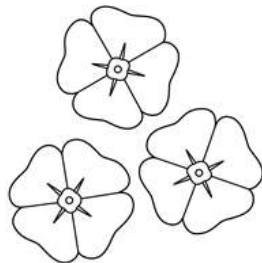

## **Notes from the Herald, August, 1918**

Fine, warm. Good harvest.

Orton's water supply is dubious. The RDC has had Orton's water-springs cleaned out and their yield measured and found to be "plenty" – "Oh no it isn't" wrote Dr. Gibson J.P. (Orton's doctor) later that month. "If we don't act soon, there'll be fever, i.e. cholera or so. The RDC's Inspector to report on this.

Tebay's Robert Nicholson, shunter, up for alleged theft of bag of railway cement. The Bench, sitting as the Police Court at Hackthorpe in the pub's special room, dismissed the case. Two crashed in one day on the line near Tebay – on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup>, early, a runaway truck tore up the rail-chairs at Lowgill. The signalmen at Dillicar noticed that the train looked odd, and alerted Tebay Station staff to have it stopped and checked. Later that day, another goods train was standing in Tebay Station being checked when a fast southbound goods train from Carlisle ran into it. Lines blocked for hours after.

Ravenstonedale's 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant Alexander Beck, R.A.F., "has become adept at downing German aircraft" (Report on 31<sup>st</sup>). Ravenstonedale Working Party has knitted 74 garments in June and July for Red Cross. ## Friends of Tarn Gill Bridge, Ravenstonedale

The Friends are delighted that Cumbria County Council, in the person of Martin Hardman, Bridges and Structures Manager, has agreed both to investigate the perceived problem with the north-east abutment of the bridge, and to make the necessary repairs to the arch barrel and the parapets using cintex anchors. The Council will meet the cost of the investigations, probable underpinning of the abutment, and the repairs, provided a viable repair can be achieved within their budget. These repairs will start as soon as the necessary permissions have been obtained, including in-river consents and ecological assessments. The Council and their Contractor hope to be able to take advantage of this continued dry weather, as of course the beck has dried up at present.

They are aware of the historic significance of the bridge, and have agreed to reinstate the parapet stone with the original OS rivet benchmark on it which came from a nearby wall when the parapet was altered – probably in the 1920's - as well as replace the unsightly metal poles with something more suitable. The Friends have offered to pay for replacement bollards more in keeping with the appearance and setting of the bridge if necessary.

Meanwhile the Friends' application for the bridge to be considered for listing as an asset of historical and/or architectural interest is with the Historic England Listings Team North based in York. This Team hopes to forward their recommendation to the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport during the next couple of months.

The Friends are intrigued to learn that Historic England refer to the bridge as Artlegarth Beck Bridge, so if all goes well and the bridge is conserved, then that will be its name "on the map" and on the interpretation board we will provide with help from the Council and Yorkshire Dales National Park through the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership.
