

# **Church Letter**

# First World War soldier saved from bullet by pocket BIBLE

In July 1915 a young man by the name of Leonard Knight enlisted to fight in the First World War.

At the time Leonard was just 17 years old and before he left home, his Aunt Minnie gave him a small pocket bible.

In it she wrote "To Leonard, with love from Aunt Minnie July 1915". Neither could have known that this little book would save his life.

The story is that Leonard was carrying the book in the breast pocket of his uniform when he was struck by a German bullet.

The round penetrated the hardback front cover but was stopped by the thickness of the Bible.



Incredibly it was halted around 50 pages from the end of the book and he escaped without a scratch.

The picture clearly shows that if the bullet had been an inch to the right Leonard's name would have almost certainly joined far too many others on a cenotaph.

It is not known what happened to the young soldier after this nearmiss although he is believed to have survived the war.

The Bible itself emerged in January 2017, with the bullet still inside it, and has been passed down through five generations of his aunt's family.

I'm sure you'll agree this really is an incredible story!

It is made more poignant as this month we celebrate 100 years since the guns fell silent on our first global war. We remember, not just those who lived through this

whose lives were tragically lost. At St Oswald's, Ravenstonedale, will be remembering the centenary with a weekend of events

remarkable time, but also those

beginning with a FOSO Supper Theatre presentation "From Westmorland to the Western Front"

on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> November at 7.30pm.

Over the weekend the History Group will also be providing an exhibition focusing on what life was like in our Parish during the War years. It can be viewed in St Oswald's Church after the performance on Friday and over the weekend.

Last, but by no means least, is Remembrance Sunday when we will remember the hundredth anniversary of the signing of the Armistice on 11<sup>th</sup> November 1918.

In our 10.55am service we will honour those locally who gave their lives for the freedom of Britain.

And we will also honour the life of another man. Jesus Christ, whose wonderful story of death and resurrection brings freedom for the whole world.

As Christians we believe that, just amazing book saved as this Leonard's life, the message of life and hope contained within the Bible can save so many more.

Indeed it promises that death need not be the last word on anyone's life.

He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain any more, for the former things have passed away. Revelation 21:3-5



# **Digging for Britons in the Lune Valley**

Lunesdale Archaeology Society and around 50 volunteers have spent 16 days excavating the settlement at High Carlingill as part of a 2-year project supported by the Heritage Lottery Fund. During the dig we had visits from several local groups, including 35 budding archaeologists from Orton school who had a lovely time in the mud!



We had our setbacks, including the theft of a trailer and equipment from the site, the demise of the gazebos in a gale, and often challenging weather conditions. But under the patient and expert guidance of archaeologists from Solstice Heritage, the apparently random mass of stone revealed on removal of the turf gradually resolved into the foundations of a series of round buildings and walls and a later cobbled trackway, complete with wheel ruts

The site has previously been surveyed and shown to be a series of roughly circular structures surrounded by a bank, with extensions on the outside. The construction of the bank had involved the movement of vast amounts of earth and stone: the tons that we removed was a fraction of the original construction. The trench opened inside the main enclosure contained several overlapping small buildings, constructed at different time, but no material finds other than a couple of pieces from quernstones and some whetstones. This suggests an early date for occupation. A building excavated in what is thought to be a later annex to the enclosure contained a few sherds of Roman pottery, and a hearth. The hearth has been sampled and we hope that carbon dating will be possible.

It seems that the site has been occupied at least since the Iron Age, around 500BC, and that later occupants had some interaction with the inhabitants of Low Borrowbridge fort.

A second excavation will take place in May/June next year.

We would like to extend our grateful thanks to David and Christine Knipe for allowing us to dig up their land, and to HLF for providing the means to employ professional archaeologists and analyse the finds.



# All Saints' Church Churchyard Conservation Project

Repair of Headstones. The responsibility for maintaining or repairing headstones in a churchyard belongs to surviving members of the family of the deceased person, not to the church. Some such families, approached by the conservation team, have paid to have stones repaired or secured. It has proved impossible to contact surviving family members to pay for repairs to many of the headstones, and volunteers have done good work to secure them. There are two pink granite pillar headstones which are notable features of our churchyard but for which no families could be found; but it was felt that rather than leave them in a fallen or leaning state, it was right to use churchyard funds to get them repaired professionally. One such job has been done and the other work is under way.



**Bulbs:** Children from Nursery and Reception classes of Orton School (aged 4 and 5) have regular "outdoor sessions", and recently this involved a visit to the churchyard. The children, helped by some parents and some of the churchyard team, had fun planting over 90 daffodil bulbs in beds prepared in advance by team members around the west, north and eastern edges of the churchyard. Their visit ended with having squash and biscuits in church, and singing their little prayer song. They will pay a return visit in the spring to inspect the flowers!

### Notes from the Herald, October 1918

Average weather. Shortages and impractical Government directives increase. Coal and coke will be rationed from 1<sup>st</sup> November but each village can order a stockpile to be kept at the Squire's/Parson's/Doctor's or similar. Butter ration cut from 2oz to 1oz per person per week. New ration-books begin on 6<sup>th</sup> November.

Germany sued for peace mid October via President Woodrow Wilson who produced terms which by late October, the Allies were considering.

Orton's Dr. Gibson's letter to the R.D.C. said that Orton Hall's small concrete bridge near Town End Bridge blocks the spates which erode the road and upset the drains and the wet land in Orton's centre flooding the nearby houses. - Sent to Orton Parish Council to remedy. (A letter to O.P.C. direct carried less clout than when endorsed by R.D.C. first).

Mr. T. W. Bowman (Orton) led Ravenstonedale Wesleyan Chapel's Harvest Service on 20<sup>th</sup>; social on Monday, 21<sup>st</sup>.

Kirkby Stephen District War Savings Certificates bought mid-October: Orton £32.1s.0d, Tebay £13.4s.0d. (Top = Mallerstang £114.15s6d). £1 then = £80 now, 1s 0d then = £4 now.

Sapper E. Stephenson, son of Mr. E. Stephenson, Orton, was riding a motorcycle with dispatches at the Front when it went over a 20ft high embankments. He is now in a Base Hospital and has had several operations.

Tebay's dairymen went to Kirkby Stephen to meet the local Food Control Committee to fix the price of milk now. "8d a quart" said the milkmen. "6d" – FCC. Milk rounds in Tebay take three hours a day and cows now cost over £60. (Multiply by 80 for 2018). The special sale of cattle and sheep (50 entered so far) at Tebay Mart on Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> will also have Mrs. Capstick's rubber tyred dogcart and her wagonette with movable top. She runs the Cross Keys.

<u>To let</u> High Scales and Eskew Head and pasture on Birkbeck Fell, Orton, occupier Mrs. Martin Hodgson, offers to R. Whitehead, Ellergill, Tebay.

A modern fairy-tale: "Once upon a time, long, long ago, they made cakes with real butter!" (Real butter has gone up this month by 2d lb; £1.20 now)

Ravenstonedale's Our Day of events for Red Cross funds was wet (as usual), Thursday 4<sup>th</sup>, but a lot there who got soaked. Deluge all day but most of the events were in the school. The Produce Show included Babies, of which the Yearling Champion was Mrs. Moore's child of Gars Hill; the two year old Champion was Mrs. Akrigg's, Ash Fell. Special prize for two year old to Mrs. Coulston, Ravenstonedale. Then came a rationed tea; Concert that evening run by Mr. R.G. Suggett of Darlington. The Treasurer was the Rev. J. Patrick. The Day made £162 so far.

To let Tarn Farm, Fell End, house plus three acres. It has unlimited rights on Yorkshire and

Ravenstonedale Commons. Tenant is Mr. T. Died in Ravenstonedale on Mon. 30<sup>th</sup> Handley. September, Miss Ann Slinger of Beckstones. A 73year-old retired farmer she was ill. Ravenstonedale's dairymen met on Wednesday evening, 2<sup>nd</sup> October and fixed their milk prices as 6d quart to 31st December and 7d quart 1st January to 30th April 1919. (1 quart = 2 pints) Harvest Services at Ravenstonedale Congregational Church Sunday 13th, Wesleyans Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> plus meeting on 21<sup>st</sup>. Preacher on Sunday was Mr. T. W. Bowman (Orton). Ravenstonedale Band of Hope (teenagers) had a Magic Lantern lecture on the evening of 23<sup>rd</sup> in the Public Room.

Late in October the Commons voted 274 - 25 to allow women to be MPs.

## Notes from the Herald, November 1918

Average weather. The Government insists on farmers increasing their ploughed acreage in 1919; the farmers defying them.

The War ended at 11am on Monday 11<sup>th</sup>. Oxroasting in Penrith. Special services in most places.

Orton's Covenanters and Feoffees fixed the date of their election of the next Vicar as 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> December. Entries close on 23<sup>rd</sup> November. (Feoffees are freeholders). The gang of four youths who set upon Christopher Dixon, 15, as he walked home on 22<sup>nd</sup> September from work at Mr. Beck's, were up in Court this month. They surrounded him near Gaisgill Chapel, beat him up and made him cry. He's fled the district since. In Court they denied it but were found guilty and fined £2 each including costs (now £160). Report was 23<sup>rd</sup> November.

The Fell Pony Society's AGM heard that many of their stallions go to the New Forest to help improve the ponies there.

Slain, Lance-Corporal John Bainbridge, an Orton lad, married, (wife now at Cotehill, ex Kirkoswald); he was pre-war Dr. Law's chauffeur (Kirkoswald) thence Army Service Corps Motor Transport section at the Front. He died of pneumonia in hospital in Salonica (Greece) age and date not said. He was brother-in-law of Police Sgt. Ritchie, Penrith. Died, probably of Spanish Flu, at Selsmire, Orton on 19<sup>th</sup>, Fred, infant son of Philip and Ann Wharton.

<u>Tebay's</u> Mr. R.W. Wilson, an active Labour man, is now a J.P. for Smethwick. On 27<sup>th</sup> October, Barbara Hunter fell over in her yard at Brockholes Farm, Tebay. Dr. Graham came out from Orton and said "She's often fainted but what caused this was a heart-attack". She was 65.

By 2<sup>nd</sup> November Spanish Flu and the pneumonia that often followed it was hitting Tebay hard. Died, probably of flu, (the deaths notices never mention it, but the reports do) at 6 North Terrace, Tebay on 29<sup>th</sup> November, John Edmund Gargate, 29. He was buried in Tebay PM Chapel yard on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup>

December. Died on 21<sup>st</sup> October at Mount Pleasant, May (or Mary?), wife of Tom Robinson, 27.

Ravenstonedale heard that the War had Ended on Monday, 11<sup>th</sup>, forenoon, and put out flags. The ringers rang a peal (a full peal takes 3 hours). The School pupils paraded the village lustily singing patriotic songs. Several adults joined them and sang too. Tuesday, 12<sup>th</sup> was a School holiday, Sunday, 17<sup>th</sup>, Special Services. Ravenstonedale's Our Day made £170 for Red Cross (now £13,600). Five house-to-house collectors, 2 ladies, 3 gents, raised £51 for the Christmas Presents Fund for Ravenstonedale's 48 serving soldiers.

<u>Died</u> at Fell End, Ravenstonedale on Monday, 28<sup>th</sup> October, Mr. Robert Hird, 83, hale till recently; lifelong of Fell End. Sudden death of Mrs. William Hunter, Fell End on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> in the afternoon, age not said. A very cheerful lady she was at Kirkby Stephen Market when she had a seizure and never came out of its coma. She was taken home unconscious by car. She leaves her husband and three adult children, two in the Army and one disabled.

One of the three bidders for New Hall Farm, Sandford, Warcop, part of Appleby Grammar School's endowment for nearly 300 years, was Mr. G. Beck, Ravenstonedale. He did not bid high enough.

<u>Died</u>, probably of Spanish Flu, at 70 Victoria Road, Middlesbrough, on 16<sup>th</sup> November, Agnes Ann, widow of Henry Tunstall of Ravenstonedale. She was 68 and was buried in Middlesbrough Cemetery on 19<sup>th</sup>. At Greenside, Ravenstonedale on 15<sup>th</sup>, James William, son of James and Sarah Winder, 29; at Sandwath on 29<sup>th</sup>, Georgina (Geenie) youngest daughter of M.A. and the late James Paley. She was 17 and died of flu, "a bright girl who won a scholarship to KSGS, hoping to teach". Report on 30<sup>th</sup>.

John Robertson of Townhead, Orton was killed by a roadside unexploded mine, on 18<sup>th</sup> November 2018.

I always though it extra tragic that Eddie's Uncle John died just a few days after the end of the war. He was one of Eddie's mother's brothers. I have a picture of everyone celebrating the end of conflict, and Grandma & Granddad Robertson receiving a telegram to say that John had been killed. It must have been terrible. He is included in the War Memorial in Orton church, and also his death is recorded on one of the family tombstones in the churchyard.

# Remembering Resistance: A Century of Women's Protest in the North of England

A call for participants and citizen researchers

"Remembering Resistance: A Century of Women's Protest in the North of England" is a new project from researchers at Lancaster University that is bringing to life the history of women's protest in the North of England.

Funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund, Remembering Resistance will celebrate, catalogue, and engage the public in women's efforts to bring about political change over the last 100 years by creating a permanent archive of women's activism to inspire future generations.

Through a programme of public engagement events and activities, the project will develop a rich picture of when, where, and why women have fought for change, to identify the most significant sites of women's resistance in the North.

The project aims to map the last century of protest by charting the routes that protests took, and the strategies protesters used, as well as collating artefacts associated with protest movements.

The outcome of the project will be integrated into the archives of local museums, and will contribute to their programmes on the struggle for women's suffrage.

To ensure the voices of women who have been involved in protest are preserved, we want to work with communities, and those involved in activism, to gather oral histories and archival accounts of protest actors, past and present.

We are inviting those who have been involved in protest, activism or campaigning, and who want to share their experiences, to get in touch with the team. We are interested in collecting oral histories from women involved in a wide range of activism, so if you or someone you know was involved in protest or campaigning over the last few decades, get in touch!

An important part of the project involves bringing together a team of volunteer citizen researchers. We're interested in hearing from people who would like to get involved with the project as a volunteer. The main things we're looking for are people who are interested in women's activism, the history of protest in the North of England, or who would like to develop skills in oral history or heritage projects.



# Broadband for the Rural North Ltd

I wonder what it was like when the railway was being built? Were people waiting excitedly for the possibility of new connections, and easier ways of travelling, doing business and meeting with people? The railway had a real impact on Tebay, with an influx of people, buildings and new ways of working. It impacted Orton and the surrounding hamlets as well, bringing activity and opportunity – creating a network of possible connections to the rest of the country.

Well, there's a new network being built at the moment, which is getting closer by the day. Last time I checked, there were branches creeping towards Tebay from Grayrigg, Killington, Firbank and Sedbergh. Not steel rails but a glass fibre, buried underground, and carrying hyperfast internet, direct to every one's door. That new network will have the same potential to transform people's situations as the railway did: whether it's catching up with Netflix, sorting out herd registers, doing your online shopping, helping our school children connect with other schools across the world, or working from home.

Even for those lucky to be near a BT cabinet with fibre connected into it, the last leg from the cabinet to your house is still copper wire which can't generally manage more than 80 Megabits per second of data. Many of us will have <u>much</u> slower connections than that – often painfully slow. A fibre internet connection to your house, connecting you to the B4RN network, would give you 1000 Megabits of data – that will be up to 100 times faster than many people's existing connections. The technology is future-proofed (the speed can be turned up!) and generally good for many years to come. That sort of speed increase makes new things possible – rather like the coming of the railway.

Broadband for the Rural North (B4RN) is a community owned non-profit project — by the community and for the community — with each community volunteering together to talk to landowners, raise money, dig trenches and make connections. There are active projects already closing in on Tebay — the nearest connecting fibre is now part

way up the Fairmile road, coming up from Lowgill. So far 53 parishes have installed, or are installing, B4RN fibre, with the commitment in each parish to connect every home or business that wants it.

As a community we have two choices – we decide to work together and bring B4RN fibre up through the Lune Gorge, into every house that wants it in Tebay & Orton and around; or we let the opportunity pass by, and keep going with our 20<sup>th</sup> century solutions that will increasingly feel slow and old, and which won't allow us and our children to benefit from this new, digital, networked future.
