#### CHURCH LETTER

#### From Neil Hughes, Reader, St. Patrick's, Bampton

#### Saved through faith?

The prospect of being 'saved' through faith will mean different things to different people. St Paul's falling from his horse as Jesus speaks to him directly 'from the ether' is perhaps the striking example while countless others have had less physically painful though necessarily less life-changing experiences! What might we expect from such 'imminent' encounters? The future St. Augustine was sitting under a tree with a book when God spoke 'in the manner of a child'. William Blake, poet and artist, once received divine creative inspiration whilst sunbathing whereas Joan of Arc was walking in the countryside when, according to the popular account, St Michael appeared to her telling her to take courage and speak up for her nation of France. John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, was at a prayer meeting in a cold basement he'd tried to avoid when he found his heart 'strangely warmed' by God's Holy Spirit.

In the Bible both younger and older men and women are not infrequently called into God's service - and thereafter salvation - through the interventions and mediation of others. Esther was advised by her uncle, Mordecai:, through a friend:

"Who knows whether you have come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" (Esther 4.14)

Isaiah, the great Old Testament prophet, was visiting the temple when God summoned him to action. Amos, another prophet, perceived heaven's judgement to be adverse with regard to the society around him (with an expectation that he might himself begin to put that right) whilst King David's psalms record an acute awareness of God's great love and forgiveness for all those who seek such things as well as his own personal (though divinely-inspired) indignation against those who dismiss them.

the New Testament individuals take up Jesus' call to simply 'follow' him. Beyond the twelve apostles (and St Paul) he had thousands of other faithful disciples.

But there were also those who let Jesus down, including Peter, 'the rock', who bitterly regretted his earlier errors and had a prime role in developing Christianity. In the Old Testament a ruler. Saul. turned away from God despite the latter's favouring him to be king, whilst Jonah, when summoned to preach in a great city, Nineveh, took a sea trip to Tarshish instead. Some of us who are lay preachers also have times when we'd sometimes like to change our slots on the rota! We all - lay or ordained - have to try to hear God's call wherever he asks us to be, though, and whatever tasks he has for us.

I think of some of the people I've known myself. In Askham, D., a Roman Catholic, first decided to try attending church too whilst on a teenage cinema visit with a friend; not a typical approach! Paul, a young priest, was an earnest socialist when he turned towards Christianity - and in some ways still is! Philip, also a cleric, practised as a lawyer in an office Paul's Cathedral. overlooking St London, where daily visible evidence of the place the divine has in our world proved too much of an attraction...

We all have something to offer others; there's a little groove or niche in God's universe for each of us . This is true even if we're not part of the Christian church. Everyone has talent! However God can use any skills we do possess most profitably of all.

Your hotline to your local councillor may temporarily be down - especially after 10 p.m. or on a Sunday evening! But hotlines to Jesus as the One divinely appointed by God, the provider of salvation for all time, do not collapse even if that line occasionally seems fragile.

This is called praying – we should all try to do it as often as we can and BT won't bill us for doing so!

#### A VIEW FROM TEBAY

When did you first notice that the summer was turning into autumn again? Did you notice a green summer leaf starting to go yellow? Did the air just feel a bit colder in the morning? Was it a grey and rainy day that made you think about the shift in the seasons?

For many families it meant a return to school after the summer break – for me it meant going back to teaching and welcoming a new class of Year 4 children eager to learn new things. Several people will have been able to make the most of the summer by going away, or taking a few days off, or making time to visit friends and sit and chat in the sun. If you did manage a break, or even a short pause in the day-to-day, hopefully you felt refreshed. We all need a break in order to function well when we're doing the routine stuff.

The autumn is traditionally the time to celebrate the fruitfulness of the earth – at the Methodist church we celebrated harvest in September, and at St James' we're celebrating on 6<sup>th</sup> October. The focus of that thanksgiving will be 'the work of our hands' and we're keen to see all those that are part of the life of the village be thanked for their work and maybe take the opportunity thankful themselves. All the creativity that will be expressed in our harvest thanksgiving, as people bring things that represent they've created or contributed to, is a reflection of the fact that we live in a world that some of us believe was also the work of God's hands. Let's all find moments to be thankful for creativity and creation this month and do all we can to share our gratitude with those around us.

# THE WESTMORLAND DALES LANDSCAPE PARTNERSHIP TEAM

The Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership Scheme has really started to gather momentum over the last few months. We now have a work base in the area at the Sidings, Tebay, which will act as an office for the team and a workshop base for the apprentices.

We also have a full team in place. David Evans, project manager, is joined by Nicola Estill as community engagement officer, Penny McMullen as Admin and Finance Officer, Hannah Kingsbury as Cultural Heritage Officer and Liz Sutton as Interpretation Officer. 

#### ORTOR MAROR COURT ANNUAL MEETING, 2<sup>nd</sup> SEPTEMBER 2019

**Present:-** Four Officers, twelve other Freeholders and one Visitor.

There were two Apologies

- 1. **Minutes** of the AGM held on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2018: these were agreed unanimously.
- 2. **Treasurer's report**: Brenda Iveson presented her report:
- a. **Income** for year 4.7.18 3.7.19: (including grass lettings, interest, Rural Payments Agency Single Farm Payment, rights of way, United Utilities wayleaves, contribution towards water rates for Meldykes, and bank interest): £1,865.38.
- b.**Expenditure:** (including water rates for Meldykes, Market Hall hire, Orton Churchyard Interpretation Board, Handrails for steps at West End, and NFU Insurance): £1,203.13.
  - c. Closing balance:

Community account: £4,936.63 Business Premium account: £8,749.10

Total: £13,685.73

#### 3. Steward's Report:

- Wendy started by thanking the Committee for their work both in and out of meetings.
- She drew attention to the Interpretation Board in the church porch, which had cost only £294, though OMC had agreed to pay up to £500.
- Grazing at Howes Quarry and Park Lane had been let, and Meldykes was let under a longer term Stewardship scheme.
- New rails has been made and erected by Roland Roof for the steps at West End, and painted by Kyle Blue.
- The rental for access for various properties around the village were to be reviewed as they had remained at their current level for many years.
- The burial of electricity cables in Knott Lane by United Utilities (Electricity North West) had prompted examination of two issues, car parking and wild flower conservation. She invited Andrew Bromley to explain these:
- Andrew Bromley said that Knott Lane afforded access to both the Scar and Gamelands Stone Circle. This sometimes resulted in cars parking on the verges of the Lane, a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) because of the wild flowers there. It also sometimes caused problems for the access of farm machinery. So the proposal was made that the first 30 metres of the access lane to Howes Quarry, directly opposite across the Raisbeck Road, should be used for car parking, with appropriate widening of the entrance, and a gate beyond it. As the ground was wet, though work on drainage had been carried out, further steps would be needed to make it firm enough for car parking. He suggested that as United Utilities would need somewhere to park their vehicles and equipment when doing the cable work, they might be glad to this parking space and might contribute to the cost. Planning permission would be needed, but the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority had been consulted.
- Crista Nelson of Cumbria Wildlife Trust was welcomed to the meeting, and explained that working with the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership there was a proposal for a roadside Nature Reserve along Knott Lane. As it was off the main road the County Council Highways Department would not be involved. The land belonged to Orton Manor Court who could therefore give the necessary permission.

Discussion followed about making the car parking area firm as it is naturally boggy, but materials are available to achieve this. A culvert would be needed for the roadside ditch. Kyle Blue mentioned getting advice from John Hughes of Armistead Barnett about compensation issues.

It was agreed that this scheme be pursued.

#### 4. Matters raised from the floor:

- a. Kyle mentioned, on behalf of Kate Blue, that the banks of the beck towards the Mill were becoming very overgrown, and suggested that the Westmorland Dales apprentices, properly supervised, might be asked to work on this.
- b. Christopher Jenkin mentioned, on behalf of Mary, that the snowberry bushes near the stocks needed pruning back, to allow access to the stocks which were of interest to visitors, especially children. It was agreed that they could receive moderate pruning.
- c. Ronnie Elliott mentioned that when the grass on the triangle at West End was mown, the cuttings were never removed, which resulted in wet grass being brought into people's homes on their footwear. Kyle explained that OMC while owning the land was not responsible for the mowing, for which Amey Ltd was contracted by the Parish Council. They did not remove grass cuttings when mowing all around the village to ask them to do so would considerably raise costs.
- d. Ronnie also mentioned the disintegrating state of the footpath in front of West End houses, which was potentially dangerous. It was agreed that the Committee would consider this matter at the next meeting.
- 5. Kyle thanked Wendy for all she did for OMC.
- 6. There being no further business, the meeting closed at 8.16 p.m.
- Date of next Committee Meeting: Monday 4<sup>th</sup> November.




