CHURCH LETTER

From the Revd. Fran Parkinson



Don't just
give up,
give
more!

LENT is one of the most important times of year for many people around the world, particularly those within Anglican, Catholic and Orthodox traditions. Different people will observe Lent in different ways, though by and large most do this by giving something up.

I confess this isn't something I've always found easy to do!

The purpose, of course, is to prepare us for Easter through prayer, fasting, as well as giving up certain luxuries in order to mirror the sacrifice of Jesus Christ's journey into the desert for 40 days. Many Christians also add a Lenten spiritual discipline, such as reading a daily devotional or praying through a Lenten calendar as a means of refreshment and renewal. When I read biblical stories of those who fasted I realise it wasn't just about self-sacrifice. Take, for example, the story of Esther. Here is a woman who acts courageously in order to save her people against a wicked King's official who is intent on destroying them.

Her story reads rather like an epic novel! But rather than attempting to gather an army she instructs her people to fast for 3 days and nights, which they do, and during that time she prepares a feast for the King!

Instead of just giving up food and drink, or giving up the cause altogether, Esther gives more. Instead of just denying ourselves during this Lenten season could it be possible for us to give more?

4 years ago I stumbled across a way to do just that with something

called **40 acts** . . .

Their website says "**40acts** is a generosity challenge for Lent, created by the UK Christian charity, Stewardship. For ten years, **40acts** has asked the question: what if Lent could be about more than just giving stuff up? What if it could be a time of radical generosity as well as spiritual discipline? Over the years, **40acts** has become a movement of over 100,000 people on a mission to impact their communities with generosity – during Lent and beyond".

Every morning between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday (except the Sundays in between) Stewardship send an email with a bible-based thought for the day followed by a challenging idea on how to give. They suggest three different ways to fulfil that challenge depending on your time and resources. Sometimes it will call for sacrificial giving, other times it might be as easy as sending a card to encourage another person. And sometimes it even involves chocolate!!!

The great thing is, no words are needed to complete the challenges, it can even be anonymous if you prefer. And if people do ask why you are doing it you can simply reply, "I'm doing 40 acts for Lent!"

I will be signing up to take part again this year as I believe it's a great way to make my faith visible and to connect the people around me with the love of God.

It's not too late to take part in this amazing venture, even if we are already in the Lenten season by the time you read this. Go to www.40acts.org.uk to sign up, either as an individual or even a group, and make a difference today!

A VIEW FROM TEBAY

From Bernard Thornborrow

I am pleased to be able to write this for the Link.

First for those who don't know me, I have lived in Tebay all my life, first attending the primary school which was much smaller than today, then moving to the "top school" which is now a B&B.

I was blessed to have a Headmaster there who was a Christian man and a Church Warden at St. James' Church - he left his mark on my life. Following my school days, at fifteen I started work locally for Mr John Rae, joiners, undertakers & decorators, then I ran my own business for many years around the area.

Over the last sixty years plus I have been very much involved in community life of Tebay, serving on Parish Council, District Council, as School governor, and a life member and steward of the Methodist Church.

I have seen many changes in this community over that time! Tebay was built around the coming of the railway. I well remember the busy days of steam trains; then came the closing of the engine sheds and the station, and then in 1967 came the construction of the M6 through the Lune Gorge. The estimated cost of building was one million pounds per mile. Construction workers and their families came from all over the UK, but the majority were from Ireland. I remember them saying "what a place to come to, out in the wilds of Cumbria!" but many were sad to leave at the end of the construction. I still have contact with one family,

The M6 opened in 1970, fifty years ago this year, opened by the then Minister of Transport, Earnest Marples. School children and villagers gathered on the M6 bridge near the slip road for the opening ceremony.

The M6 was constructed by John Laing, an excellent company providing for the needs of the workforce and their families, shopping buses to Kendal and buses to Tebay school which was full to capacity. The former Conservative Club became the Catholic Church with a resident Priest; there was a large caravan site at Borrow Bridge farm and the old school building became a hostel.

The coming of the M6 brought many changes to Tebay putting Tebay on the map, making for easier access to anywhere in the country. Westmorland Services are well known throughout the country and beyond.

I well remember being in France in

a coffee shop and talking to a local man who asked me where I came from. I said: "A little village called Tebay in the north of England." And he said "I know it well! I stayed last week at The Westmorland Hotel!" I replied saying "I decorated the room you stayed in!" (Small world!)

Looking back to the time in Tebay when there were into the teens of shops - three co-ops, two grocers, bakers, a shoe shop and the famous Tommy Atkinson's (better known as Dougie's). At the south end of Tebay was a cobbler, cycle repairer and ironmonger, selling anything from a pin to an elephant. There were also various tradesmen calling door to door selling from their vans - butcher, baker, fishmonger. Today we have a Post Office and the J38 shop, but often looking out we see Sainsbury's, Asda or Tesco vans making deliveries - very similar to the older tradesmen.

Over the last few months it's been a pleasure to welcome new people into our village coming from different parts of the country and making their new homes in Tebay.

To them I would say there are a variety of organizations which would be pleased for you to join in! It is very encouraging to those who like myself have been involved over the years. New people bring new ideas and enthusiasm. You can find out more about these organizations in this *Link*.

As I write this article we are still in the middle of winter with cold dark days, but we can look forward to the warmer days of spring. Already snowdrops have appeared, and soon the community can once again come out of hibernation meeting up with each other again.

Keep smiling! Spring is coming.

Tebay Anglers

Tebay Anglers was founded in 1944. The Club's waters cover some 15 miles of Brown Trout, Sea Trout and Salmon fishing along the River



Lune, and its tributaries, from Kelleth to the Sedbergh end of Fair Mile. The migratory trout normally reach the area sometime in June, and salmon generally appear from August.

The source of the Lune is at Newbiggin-on-Lune, some 7 miles North-East of Tebay. The river is fed by numerous fell streams. Changes in flow and depth can be quite dramatic depending on conditions. The Club's stretch can pose a wide range of challenges to the angler.

The Club operates in conjunction with, and is now a Corporate Member of, Lune Rivers Trust (LRT) to conserve, protect and improve the wildlife habitat in and along its stretch. Committee members can regularly be found mending fences, protecting the banks from erosion or monitoring for pollution. Committee members are also empowered to protect the fishing from poaching.

Abridged Minutes of the Committee Meeting held on Monday 3rd February 2020

- 1. PRESENT:** Twelve Committee members. One Committee member was absent.
- 2. Minutes:** The Minutes of the Committee Meeting held on Monday 4th November 2019 had been circulated, and were agreed and signed.
- 3. Matters Arising from the Minutes:**
 - a. Compost (Item 10a)** Compost for the planters in the Market Hall square had been obtained. Two new volunteers have been valuable helpers. A donation of plants has been offered.
 - b. New Committee members (Item 10b):** One committee member has not attended for over a year, and under the Constitution has thereby forfeited membership of the Committee. A potential new member was suggested and would be approached.
- 4. Treasurer's report:**
 - a.** The Current Account stands at £6,164.16, and the Premium Account at £8,757.82. Two rents are awaited.
 - b.** Electricity North West are about to connect the supply to a lamp post at the southern end of the village.
- 5. Knott Lane:** There has been no further progress, though there has been liaison with tenants affected by the scheme. The Nature Reserve plan of Cumbria Wildlife Trust was agreed.
- 6. Meldykes:** Natural England have rolled over the Enhanced Stewardship scheme for a further year, i.e. till 2022. The rent is £350 p.a.
- 7. Grass Lettings:** A notice will go in the March and April issues of *The Link*.
- 8. Footpath in front of West End houses:** After inspection it was recommended that no action be taken.
- 9. Rent Increases:** The residents would be sent a letter warning them that an increase of rent is possible in the future, since it has been unchanged for many years.
- 10. Any Other Business: none.**
- 11. Dates of future Committee Meetings:** Mondays 27th April, 22nd June, 7th September (AGM) and 9th November 2020. The meeting closed at 8.13 p.m.

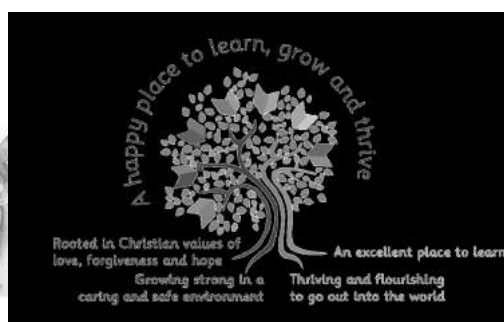

Ladies That Bus

An insight into the rural world of the 555 bus

highlights

rural touring scheme



Orton Market Hall invites audiences to a new comedy drama with music entitled **Ladies That Bus**, to be performed in Orton on Saturday 7 March. Commissioned by the theatres in Keswick, Kendal and Lancaster – the three towns connected by the 555 bus - the comedy will be touring rural venues as part of the Highlights Rural Touring Scheme Spring season.

In September 2018, the 'Ladies' met over 500 people during interviews, workshops and on the 555 itself, getting to know the area, the people and the stories. The

resulting play is based on those interviews, conversations and stories collected from travellers between Lancaster and Keswick.

A tale of journeys taken and not taken, of regrets and celebrations, of isolation and what it means to be free, **Ladies That Bus** is based on real-life and peppered with humour, songs and original music. The play shows a day-in-the life of the Route 555 bus and the kaleidoscope of different characters that travel on it – each with their very own tales to tell.

Ladies That Bus is the creation of actor and composer Helen Longworth (currently playing Hannah Riley in Radio 4's *The Archers*); director Kirstie Davis; writer and actor Joyce Branagh; theatre-maker and actor Eve Robertson and Nicola Jayne Ingram.

"We didn't know what to expect" says Joyce Branagh, lead writer on the project. "We didn't know what people would tell us – but it's been amazing, and such a range – from secret love trysts, tippy Abba tribute acts, teenage 'bus tribes', and the people that we've lost, to the simple things that have brought joy, as well as one real-life murder. We've heard it all."

"**Ladies That Bus** was due to be performed at Shap," explains Orton's volunteer promoter, Sally Seed, "but a venue clash resulted in the move to Orton. We're excited about having the performance here as the 'Ladies' have been on local radio talking about the show and that's created a lot of interest. We're also really grateful to the team at Cumbria Classic Coaches in Ravenstonedale as they're providing a bus from Shap to Orton (and back) on the night to make sure Shap Highlights enthusiasts still get to see the play."

Notes from the Herald, March, 1920

Fine first week, then cold and showery.
Orton's Mr. W.H. Huck, The Mill, Orton, died on Saturday 28th February aged 73, ailing. He had been Coachman to the late Colonel Burn at Orton Hall for years. Before setting off for the funeral the choirs of the Parish Church and Wesleyan Chapel sang at his house and Mr. G. Alderson (Tebay) led in prayer. In his youth Mr. Huck was a servant of Mr. W.H. Wakefield at Prizet.

The County Council is seeking land in Orton for allotments for two men there and in Ravenstonedale for one man. It has appointed its first County Land Agent.

Tebay (see also Orton above) No other news.

Ravenstonedale's War Memorial was unveiled by Mrs. Metcalfe-Gibson, Elm Lodge, after a united service in the Parish Church, the Rev. Mr. Patrick (Ravenstonedale Congregational Church) preaching the sermon.

Newbiggin-on-Lune's Mrs. Windross, licensee of the Oddfellows' Arms Inn applied to Kirkby Stephen Police Court's J.P.s for leave to stay open till 11pm for the Returned Soldiers' Supper on 7th April. "Go hold it elsewhere" said the police; the Court agreed with them.

Westmorland RDC has several roads now needing to be strengthened for current increase of motor traffic, (larger, heavier, faster) including the Orton to Shap road.

Ravenstonedale's Welcome Home for its ex-servicemen, Friday, 12th in the Endowed School (crowded) – concert, presentations; supper in the King's Head Temperance Hotel – Report on 20th, p2 lists the men.

On Wednesday 24th March at Newbiggin Station a runaway horse and cart ran over William John Fothergill fatally. He was 37, ex-Army, Blencarn but probably from Ravenstonedale in descent.
Addendum to February, 1920

Dent v Hewison (report 21st February) for bothering three young chapel-going women – they did so in Newbiggin-on-Lune.

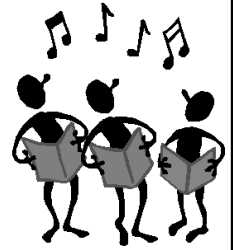

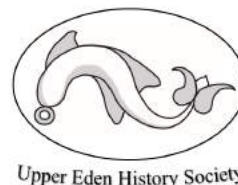

ORGAN DONORS REQUIRED!

St Oswald's Victorian Organ requires a major overhaul, can you help preserve one of Cumbria's finest musical instruments?

The organ at St Oswald's, the Parish Church of Ravenstonedale, was commissioned in 1881 by Anthony Metcalfe-Gibson, a local landowner, in memory of his father. It was built by Harrison & Harrison who regularly service the organ and are regarded to be amongst Britain's finest church pipe organ builders for over a century.

It is great testament to Victorian engineering that almost 140 years after its installation, the organ is still in regular use at Sunday services, and particularly enjoyed at Christenings, weddings and funerals. However, regular servicing can no longer manage the slow structural deterioration which increasingly results in malfunctions.

After lengthy consideration St Oswald's PCC have committed to restoring the organ to its original state, to be enjoyed by the parish and visitors for another 100 years.

The dismantling of the organ during restoration also presents an opportunity to remove, restore and re-locate a prayer board that many will never have seen because it's mounted on the wall behind the organ!

This wooden prayer board matches one mounted on the opposite side of the church and features the 10 commandments. Both boards date back to the previous church building at St Oswald's - long before 1738!

The cost of the organ restoration is around £65,000, not including restoring and relocating the prayer board.



Alexander Finch, an internationally renowned organist who regularly performs recitals all over the world, grew up in the neighbouring village of Newbiggin-on-Lune and was at school close by: "...Playing the organ at St Oswald's was an inspiration to my progress as a pupil at Sedbergh School. I remain immensely grateful for the opportunity...". Alexander agrees that the organ at St Oswald's is an instrument of historical importance.

of revising and hard work all four of us apprentices passed our
chainsaw assessments. Before attending the course, we had to
build a work bench for the maintenance of the saws. We built
the bench from larch, sawmilled at Appleby and it is very
sturdy. After we finished the bench we needed to get kitted
out with specialist chainsaw trousers, helmets, boots and
gloves.



Now for a week in the woods.
Our tutor, Bob Barkes was
amazing at teaching us
throughout the course. We
learnt quite a few different
techniques for felling trees
such as a 'standard' cut for
upright trees and a 'Danish'

cut for any tree at any angle. To fell a heavily forward leaning
tree we learnt a 'dogs tooth' cut and a 'split level' felling cut for
a heavily leaning backwards tree. I'm now looking forward to
putting my new skills into practice over the remaining winter
when we will be coppicing and clearing scrub in the
Westmorland Dales.

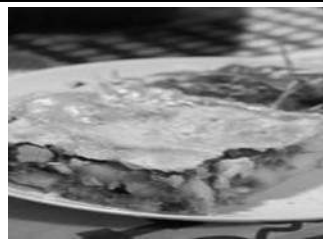
