CHURCH LETTER

From the Revd. Philip Rigby, retired Methodist Minister

This is being written nearly a month before you will read it, and in the present circumstances it's hard to know how relevant anything I might say will turn out to be. But some things can be said, even in these strange times, when to a large extent we support and care for one another by staying away from each other!

When we are being very careful about being too close to other people who aren't part of our close household, so as to minimise the risk of transmitting infection, which we are told we may be carrying even if we are without symptoms, it's very easy to feel cut off from meaningful human contact.

We go to the shop, and rush in and out in the hope of reducing our risk to others as well as ourselves; we stay well apart in the pub, or outside the school gates, and in other places which in more normal times would be a natural gathering place.

Even in church, it's a strange experience to be part of a congregation carefully dotted about the building, sitting well apart, being unable to sing, and sometimes finding it hard to recognise someone behind their face mask, even though we might know them quite well!

These difficulties must be much worse for those who live alone and rely on such occasions as these for some human contact which breaks up their isolation. If this is your circumstance, be aware that you are not forgotten, and please don't hesitate to use the telephone or other safe means to get in touch or keep in touch with other people.

For what we must not forget in all this separatedness is that we are all in this together. And that means doing all we can to support each other and look after each other through our thoughtfulness, sympathetic understanding and using our opportunities to offer practical help.

A few weeks ago I came across a reference to an African philosophy known as Ubuntu. This is sometimes summarised as "I am because we are" - and if ever there was a time when we needed to appreciate our interdependence, that surely is now. When we are all living under the same potential surely the threat, this is moment to turn aside from the "Us and Them" mentality that is so pervasive in our world.

This is our opportunity to learn once and for all that it is together that we can move forward, because then we pool our resources, learn from each other, share with each other, and so grow together.

Then we really can live in the hope, and see the tiny signs, of better things to come.



Orton Surgery and Shap Medical Practice

APPOINTMENTS

Sadly it is not possible at the moment to book a face to face doctors appointment at Orton surgery. The doctors and nurses are continuing to operate a telephone first system at Shap Medical Practice. It is also possible to have a video consultation if you wish.

If a face to face consultation is needed, it will be arranged for you on the same day at Shap surgery. Some telephone and video appointments can be pre-booked online, otherwise contact the surgery at 8.30am to arrange one. Surgery attendance for appointments will be kept to a minimum to reduce the risk of infection to our patients.

Please check the NHS 111 website if you are unwell with cough, fever or change in sense of smell or taste symptoms.

FLU CLINIC

We have arranged a flu clinic for all eligible patients who have not yet had their flu vaccination and who live in the Orton/Tebay area, on the afternoon/early evening of Thursday 26th November. We are waiting to hear from NHS England about stocks of flu vaccinations for people who are over 50 with no underlying health problems and will be contacting people about these at a later date. It is really important that all eligible patients have their flu vaccine this year as it will help to rule out a flu diagnosis if COVID is suspected. The flu vaccine helps protect against the main types of flu viruses. If you do get flu after vaccination it's likely to be milder and not last as long. It will also stop you spreading flu to other people.

MEDICATION

Prescriptions will be available for collection from the Orton Village Hall between 10am and 11am on TUESDAYS. Any not collected will be returned to Shap.

If you are shielding or have difficulty collecting your prescriptions please let us know. We can arrange delivery or refer to the 'Good Sam' Service for help.

The Link -Whether to print?

From the Editor

As I write this, a day or two before I expect to email this issue out to nearly 300 email addresses, serious consideration is being given to the future distribution of *The Link*.



We have heard quite a number of complaints from people who are not on email about the lack of printed copies; and we are very aware that, despite kind comments about the digital version, most recipients probably only open it once (if at all), whereas people who received printed copies (back in the day) would leave it on the coffee table and different members of the household might have a look several times in the month, and refer back to adverts or announcements of events.

So is there no way to supply printed copies again, while still keeping Covid-19 rules?

- 1. It has been pointed out that post office mail is still being delivered, and newspapers are still reaching our shops. Why is The Link different and apparently more dangerous?
- 2. It has been suggested that we could just print perhaps 25 copies for each village, leaving them in some public place e.g. Post Office, for people who want one to help themselves.
- 3. Another suggestion has been mailshots companies who deliver advertising material to millions of front doors. We are exploring this seriously, and awaiting quotations from such companies; it would cost a good deal more than our usual locally-printed copies, delivered free by volunteers, but we have had no printing bills for eight months, so should we maybe spend more on getting at least the December/January issue printed and delivered this way?
- 4. Some mailshot companies require actual names and addresses (a massive operation, even if within Data Protection guidelines); others seem willing to deliver to every home in a district.



We will explore very carefully what is the right way forward.

THE END OF SUMMER

Tuesday, 20th October 2020

Like the last game of the cricket season, nothing signifies more the end of summer than the cows going home. For five months, the small herd of various beef breeds has roamed the fell-side fields next to our hill farm. They were juveniles when they came in May, youngsters who kicked up their heels with joy at their freedom. They patrolled their wide boundary and trampled fences to further their grazing rights. They found the best places to rest and chew their cud, growing slowly on the poorer pasture of the fell. Fired up with curiosity, they chased the dog, but soon learned that neither the dog nor I was a threat, but more of a daily fixture as we walked across their territory. Towards the end of their stay, we could quite comfortably walk around them without eliciting much more than a second glance and a sideways shuffle from them.

Today, looking strong and healthy with their bright eyes and shiny coats, the cows trundled off the fell and, in the glow of the autumn morning, they ambled up our farm track, snatching mouthfuls of grass and wondering why they hadn't been offered this treat before. At the end of the lane, without any fear or fuss, they were guided into the cattle pen and calmly strolled into the waiting trailer, their heavy hooves clanking and rattling on the metal ramp. I said a silent 'goodbye' as I watched them leave for their winter quarters.

I shall miss their lamp-lit eyes, spooky watchers of woman and dog, on a night-time walk by the wood. I shall miss just watching their behaviour; the

blue grey who was quite bossy and the white one who stood apart from the rest, as if given the cold shoulder. And I will remember the morning when they gadded about the field, like children in a playground, to regroup in a corner where there was an insubstantial gate. They stopped their jostling and larking when one barged through the gate to freedom. Where one goes the others follow, and they trotted down our farm track towards the farm yard, except for the white one. A few minutes later



he came trotting rapidly towards his mates, mooing loudly as if to say, "Where are you? You've left me behind." Order was restored quickly and they settled into another field.

The fields are quiet, but not empty. Pheasants have flown over to escape from a nearby shoot. The Jack snipe rises rapidly from the bog where he has been feeding. Scat is found in prominent positions marking a fox's territory. Summer has ended, but the cycle of life continues.

Open The Book
We are still taking the Bible stories into our schools!

(That film involved splicing together 19 sections!) We are now working out how to film the angels visiting the shepherds by night (to be filmed on the fell), and then the final one will show the wise men visiting the Christ Child.

Markets, outside in the Market Square. All proceeds will go to Orton Parish Church (with permission from the Orton Farmers' Market Committee).



News from All Saints' Church, Kasese, Uganda (parish linked with All Saints', Orton)

WhatsApp messages from the Rev. Nelson Walima, vicar:

8th October: My wife Melina and I have been busy during lockdown in our family garden. We grow egg plants, cassava, banana stems, maize,

G-nuts, pumpkins and beans. Thank you for your prayers and support.

18th October: Kindly pray for rains upon our crops because they are drying up due to lack of rainfall. There is very little rain in some parts of Kasese district. During your worship today pray with us so that we get rains.



(We passed on this message,

and included prayer for rain in the service at All Saints, Orton. We told him we had done so.)

Later that day:

Thanks for the prayers upon our lack of rains. God has answered immediately, it is raining now in the municipality, and we are getting good news that it is also raining at our garden (30km away from Kasese). This is a good testimony from both of us, I led the session of praying for rainfall at all 6 services, while Rev. Sandra led the same prayer at your place of worship. Thanks so much - continue!

20th October: We have had two overnight rains since you joined us in prayers for Kasese rains.

20th October: Kindly hear another good story. At our Diocesan Staff Meeting on 10th September, they have promoted me to the office of Archdeacon, about 6km from where I am serving. I will be in charge of 6 parishes (which he names, including his present parish in Kasese). These parishes together have 46 congregations. I will be an Overseer to all these congregations. This Office is to begin 1st January 2021. This again shall require your continuous prayers....

(Our reply: What a huge responsibility! Will there be another person to minister at All Saints. Kasese - a curate?)

His reply: Yes, they will send another Priest here to minister. I shall introduce her/him to you in January. She/he will be giving reports to me as an Overseer.

Traditional Farm Building Conservation Grant

A new grant scheme has been launched by the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership and Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority offering financial support to local landowners and farmers within the Westmorland Dales to conservation work on a number of traditional farm buildings. These buildings are a distinctive feature of the Westmorland Dales landscape but they are also one of the most vulnerable types of historic building in the area. With dramatic changes in farming practices over the last 50 years, many farm buildings are now redundant and have therefore been demolished, left to decay or converted to other uses. A small number of grants are now being made available to assist with restoration work to save these important cultural assets, raise their profile and help to reveal their importance to the heritage of the Westmorland Dales.

The Traditional Farm Building Conservation Grant scheme is now open for expressions of interest, with a deadline of Friday 4th December 2020. 





Ravenstonedale

A tale of house mysteries launches 'live audience' Ravenstonedale History talks

With the generous support of the Newbiggin-on-Lune public hall committee and a grant from the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership, Ravenstonedale Parish History Group (RPHG) were able to entertain members to the first live history talk since February 2020. Newbiggin-on-Lune public hall ensured social distancing rules were strictly adhered to and Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership provided a grant to support costs incurred in the use of the hall, allowing the event to go ahead despite limitation on the numbers able to attend.

An audience of 14 members attended Val Fermer's talk 'Who used to live in your house'. In her talk, Val presented history for five houses located in Ravenstonedale Parish. The history spanned from 1500 to the point when current occupiers became the latest owner of the property. The talk was developed by linking findings from a range of different historical sources including the unique references that are held by RPHG in their archive, located at the Ravenstonedale Community and Heritage centre.

These references include original sales prospectuses which are the details prepared by the auction house responsible for the sale of the property and they are extensive printed documents, containing maps, a detailed description of the property and can be cross referenced to other local history sources such as census records which can confirm identity of owner and if different the occupier.

RPHG has its own 'searchable' excel file which is an extraction of electoral registers that are cross referenced with sales prospectuses. Similarly sales prospectuses are cross referenced to the Poor Law Returns. Also known as rate returns, these were local taxes which used the valuation of freehold property, administered by parish, introduced as a tax in 1834 to enable the rising cost of caring for the poor to be financed. Local press reports, held by RPHG in collected scrapbooks of newspaper cuttings give an insight into the lives lived by the owners and occupiers, for example Joseph Ewbank, a butcher and for 60 years a Methodist preacher.

In some cases the property was occupied by the same family for almost 100 years, from 1585 to 1669. Tales from the house histories included tales of an 1876 legal dispute involving Ruth and Jane Scarborough, (an original photo of one of the sisters was presented), the scandal of the postman and his landlady (which led to their marriage in 1943) and a Gretna Green elopement (and a party to celebrate the marriage at a Newbiggin-on-Lune pub). In the case of the elopement, two versions of

the story exist in RPHG archives, one from an 1851 newspaper cutting and the contradictory report from a personal recollection collected in a published history of the Ravenstonedale Hewetson family.

The properties were owned by local landowners, distant landlords, included one who died at King's Lynn in Norfolk and another who was the founder of Kendal's former Crewdson and Wakefield Bank. William Wakefield died in a hunting accident in 1889, leaving a fortune of over £9 million (today's valuation).

In her vote of thanks, Diana Fothergill made mention of the huge amount of work that the compilation of the talk will have involved, and Val Fermer was delighted to finally have the opportunity to present her findings to the RPHG members, in person, to a live audience and in a safe situation.

Oh Dear, Still Staying in and Sewing

I think by now we all hoped that the worst of this would be over and life would be getting back to nearer normal, but that is not the case. For October's journal I have gone back to my early life in Suffolk and have a thatched cottage. Not in the traditional Suffolk pink as I never liked the colour.

October was the time for the home harvest to be processed. Fruit was bottled or made into jam for the winter. Runner beans were salted and put into an earthenware jar and others were pickled or put into the vegetable clamp and covered with the old rag rug to keep the frost off. Apples were wrapped in old newspapers and put into cold storage and you hoped the mice didn't get to them.

Then it was time to sit in front of a log fire and start making Christmas presents. Some of those would have been from the fruit bottled but they all needed special labels and there were only two months to Christmas so no time to waste. Maybe this year people will start thinking about making presents as we all spend more time at home.

Like many parish clergy, we used to get

people coming to the door asking for money or food or a bed for the night. 30 years ago, or even 20 years ago, the typical person knocking would be a "gentleman of the road"; we would give them a mug of tea and a sandwich – though I remember one man complaining that the bread was stale – to which my response was that it was what we were eating!

But more recently, and more distressingly, the typical customer became a young woman who had bought Christmas presents for her children from a so-called catalogue, and got into debt; our response changed too – I would take them to Tesco to do an essentials shop and then drive them home.

I hope this short story brings home to you, as it did to me, the problem of debt and the danger of pay day loan sharks. So when Credit Unions got going — in many places with huge support from church members — I was delighted and excited. The Bible has a lot to say about debt and high interest rates — all of it highly critical; so Christians and others doing something about it seems to me to be the sort of active obedience we need to follow. Credit Unions are for everyone and provide affordable loans. Their customers include people of no interest to high street banks because the loans are too small or they don't meet their lending criteria.

Did you know that in Cumbria, a number of Credit Unions have amalgamated into Affinity Credit Union, which covers the whole county? www.affinitycu.co.uk.

During the pandemic, as so many businesses are struggling, and so many more people are becoming unemployed or are on reduced wages, I think the need for Affinity will increase hugely.


We can do two things:



If you're a homeowner or residential landlord you can apply for a Green Homes Grant voucher towards the cost of installing energy efficient improvements to your home. Improvements could include insulating your home to reduce your energy use or installing low-carbon heating to lower the amount of carbon dioxide your home produces.

You must redeem the voucher and ensure improvements are completed by 31st March 2021.

How much you can get?

Vouchers will cover two-thirds of the cost of eligible improvements, up to a maximum government contribution of £5,000.
