

A VIEW FROM TEBAY

Just as I started to write this article another national lockdown has been announced, taking us back to the strict restrictions we were under back in March, making it very difficult for many people, adding stress to their lives with uncertainties about employment, back on furlough, not been able to meet and visit family and friends, and lack of social interaction for various groups - and our churches closed again.

On Sunday past a joint service was held at the Methodist Church. This service was conducted by Rev Kevin Roberts via a Zoom link. His subject was well suited for the present situation we find ourselves in FACING UNCERTAINTY. Uncertain about the future; new ways of doing things.

It appears to me that we will not be moving back to the way we were, but finding new and exciting ways. Many now rely on computers, IPads, video links, zoom and online shopping - click and collect.

I remember when I was involved with Age Concern a member of staff gave a talk at the Day Centre at Tebay about all the different aids to help access etc. when getting older. She said of course you can go online. The late Stan Guy turned to me and said only thing I have on line is my washing!

How things have changed over the years! Looking back, Tebay was a busy railway village up until the 1960s, with a constant change of population. Then fifty years ago saw the opening of the Motorway. At the outset of construction it again brought change to Tebay. Hundreds of new people from Ireland, Scotland and many parts of this country came to live in Tebay to work on the construction. There was a large campsite at Borrowbridge and accommodation at the old School. The Conservative Club became the Catholic Church with a resident Priest.

The numbers in the school more than doubled. The contractor John Laing provided a bus to transport the children to school and take parents shopping to Kendal.

It was a major project with many large bridges, and thousands of tons of rock were blasted out of Jeffery Mount. It was estimated to cost one million pounds per mile. This again brought great change to Tebay, with new employment opportunities, and bringing easier access to many parts of the country. Change is nothing new to Tebay, so whatever the changes are in the future we will take up the challenge and move forward.

I know many are wondering what Christmas will be like this year with Covid-19 still around. It may curtail our shopping, but does that really matter in times like this? We may not be able to party with family and friends and celebrate in our usual way, but one thing is certain - the true meaning of Christmas will not change. Jesus was born in a humble stable: no bright lights or tinsel, just a star shining in the east. He came to bring hope to the world, love, joy and peace - and how we need that peace today. The Christmas message is not lost because of Covid-19.

I take this opportunity to wish you a happy and blessed Christmas. Let us come again to the stable and celebrate the birth of Jesus. Come on and celebrate!

The boxes need to come back to school in time for a Christingle assembly in the last week of term. School will remind the children beforehand.

During the last week, a short assembly will be held – led by a video presentation and all the children will be able to give in their boxes and join in with a song and display their Christingles – before taking them home in the orange bags.

The Link -Whether to print? From the Editor

Once again serious consideration has been given to the distribution of *The Link*.



There is a steady stream of complaints from people who really miss getting their printed copy.

Only last week I had an email - yes, from someone who *can* get the digital copy! - saying "I would like a printed copy and will pay!" And another lady, who uses email, said "I can't be doing with reading it on the screen!" And of course there are probably hundreds of people, mostly but not only older folk, who do not have email at all, and so haven't seen a *Link* since March.

So is there no way to supply printed copies again, while still keeping Covid-19 rules?

- We did hope briefly to be able to use Royal Mail Door-to-Door, who - we were told - would deliver bare copies to every postcode, and *The Link* covers 98 postcodes. But then we found they would only deliver to *part* of the postcode - just to "CA10 3..." or "CA17 4..." - which includes about 5000 homes! Back to the drawing board....
- So why not just print perhaps 50 or 100 copies for each village, leaving them in some public place e.g. Post Office or church porch, for people who want one to help themselves? This method is not recommended by central and diocesan church authorities, as it carries an element of risk of infection. (And how would people know it was there?)
- 3. So we approached a Mailshot company, Baker Goodchild of Birmingham, who will print *in full colour*, insert in translucent, biodegradable bags, and arrange delivery by post to all addresses in the 98 postcodes of the usual *Link* delivery area. This is very expensive, and can only be considered for this single issue; but we have money in the funds from saving on printing this year, and we feel that at Christmas it is worth it to communicate with all our parishioners, not just those with email access.



So that is how you have got your copy! (We will also send it by email, to those who prefer to read it on screen! Yes, many people do!)

COVID VACCINATIONS

The news about a COVID vaccine is very welcome and very hopeful. We anticipate that the GP practices in Eden will be working together to deliver a vaccination programme, once there is a licensed vaccine available. We will be contacting you once we know more details about a vaccination programme. At the moment we have been told the vaccines will need to be given from "a central location" due to the cold storage required. We hope it will be possible to offer a vaccination programme as close to our own area as possible but are awaiting further instructions from the Department of Health and the North Cumbria Clinical Commissioning Group. We intend to keep everyone fully informed when we know more about the plans.

APPOINTMENTS

Sadly it is not possible at the moment to book a face to face doctor's appointment at Orton surgery. The doctors and nurses are continuing to operate a "telephone first" system at Shap Medical Practice. It is also possible to have a video consultation if you wish.

If a face to face consultation is needed, it will be arranged for you on the same day at Shap surgery. Some telephone and video appointments can be prebooked online, otherwise contact the surgery at 8.30am to arrange one. Surgery attendance for appointments will be kept to a minimum to reduce the risk of infection to our patients.

Please check the NHS 111 website if you are unwell with cough, fever or change in sense of smell or taste symptoms.

MEDICATION

Prescriptions will be available for collection from the Orton Village Hall between 10am and 11am on TUESDAYS. Any not collected will be returned to Shap.

If you are shielding or have difficulty collecting your prescriptions please let us know. We can arrange delivery or refer to the 'Good Sam' Service for help.

If you have internet access then please check the practice website and Facebook pages for updates.

FLU VACCINATIONS

We put in an application for use of the 'Melissa' bus so that we could do vaccinations from the bus which would be more Covid-safe - Didn't think we would get this but we have! So we are now having to reschedule the flu clinic from Orton to Tebay social club as it has a large area for the bus to park in and room for awnings at the side for us to give the vaccines from.



Steve Simpson has headed the 106 Bus Partnership since it began in 2014 when the County Council withdrew support for subsidised bus services. The Partnership, which is a registered charity, operates a bus service between Kendal and Penrith two days per week, providing an essential service so isolated rural residents can access shops and services. The bus route serves the parishes of Eamont Bridge, Clifton, Lowther, Hackthorpe, Thrimby, Shap, Orton, Tebay and Grayrigg.

Unfortunately Steve has been unwell over the past 18 months and so has decided to step down from the role, although he will stay on as a trustee of the charity.

At the Annual General Meeting of the Partnership this week, John Owen was elected as the new chair of the partnership. John is a well known public figure through his work as a former local police officer, former president of the Rugby Football Union and in a consultancy role with Penrith Rugby Club. Latterly John has been a councillor on Eden District Council.

Trustee of the 106 Bus Partnership, Libby Bateman said, "I want to record my gratitude to Steve Simpson for the determination, courage and leadership he has given to the 106 Bus Partnership through its inception and beyond for the past six years. Together we have achieved an innovative and sustainable model of delivering public transport to a rural area, we have faced many challenges but we are still going strong and providing a vital service for communities that would be completely cut-off without the bus.

"We're very grateful to John for stepping forward to take up the role of Chair and we are very much looking forward to working with him as we recognise him as somebody with excellent leadership skills and a genuine passion for improving the sustainability and vitality of our rural communities."

John Owen commented, "I'm looking forward to working with the 106 Bus Partnership to ensure the bus service remains sustainable into the future for the benefit of people living along the route who don't have access to a car. It's really important that people can maintain their independence and get into Penrith and Kendal to access service, go shopping and meet with friends."

Broadband Fibre

Fed up with slow and erratic broadband internet



connections? Peter Cotterill and Andrew Forsyth in Weasdale are working with B4RN to pull together interest for a bid to bring fibre-based broadband services into Ravenstonedale and Newbiggin-on-Lune and the outlying communities. Unlike BT offerings, this will bring a fibre optic directly into the home with a speed

of around 1Gb/second.

There is a funding package which lapses at the end of March 2021 and so some fast footwork will be required to attract enough interested parties to make this project viable.

To help speed progress, a new community volunteer website: <u>www.ravenstonedalefibre.com</u> has been created and you are invited to visit this and complete a simple on-line survey which will only take a few minutes to complete. From here, you will be able to watch the (hopefully) climbing numbers towards the critical target and share in the progress of the whole project.

A similar scheme was recently completed very successfully in Raisbeck & Sunbiggin and this one will also rely upon a proper shared community effort to bring it to fruition. Another project is already well underway for properties on the north side of the A685 and this one hopes to encompass a span from The Fat Lamb to Artlegarth, Ravenstonedale, Newbiggin on Lune, Weasdale and all points in between. If enough properties in Bowderdale are also engaged, then it will be a relatively easy jump to extend the line there.

Even if you are not serious internet users now, it is inevitable that future occupants of your property will value internet speeds that will be the envy of many. With more and more employees now



working from home, streamed entertainment services being delivered by the internet and telephone services moving to the internet, a sound, fast internet service has never been more important.



I wish I knew more about his life in the service but as he was working at an experimental establishment I don't suppose he could tell me as he had signed the secrecy declaration. We now should remember everyone who gave their lives for our country.


