CHURCH LETTER

From the Rev. Sandra Ward

Dear all
It is good to be back with you. I spent a couple of years in the benefice of Lorton and Loweswater with Buttermere – a short vacation perhaps? I enjoyed the beautiful area and the people there. When I thought about the word vacation (apart from acknowledging that it would have to be a staycation this year) my mind thought of the word 'vocation'. My vocation took me to Lorton and Loweswater with Buttermere and now I am 'retired' from parish ministry (if there is such a word) but I am assisting where I can and I am still Chaplain at Penrith Hospital.

By the time you read this we will just have celebrated Petertide and this is ordination time. The weekend nearest the Feast of St Peter the Apostle on 29th June and the days between are the traditional time for men and women to be ordained to the diaconate or to the priesthood, The other traditional time to be ordained is Michaelmas, the season around the Feast of St Michael and All Angels on 29th September.

On Saturday 26th June Bishop James will lay his hands on their heads with the words "Send down the Holy Spirit on your servant N for the office and work of a Deacon/ Priest in your Church" and they will be sent out to begin their new ministry among us.

We in the High Westmorland Benefice have been richly blessed with ordained and authorised lay ministry. However we now need more ministry and it is a great opportunity for those who feel called to spread the Gospel in many different ways. Christ said, "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit" (John 15:16) and

Isaiah responded to God's call: "Whom shall I send? and who will go for us?" "And Isaiah said, "Here I am. Send me." (Isaiah 6:8)

But these men and women who are to be ordained this year are not being ordained to minister *for* us, they are being ordained to minister *with* us and to unlock, through their leadership and their example, the real ministry of the church – the ministry of all God's people. Authentic ministry generates more ministry – it's one of the ways we know when the Holy Spirit is at work among us. In some parts of the church, it's the custom to send round "ember cards", little cards giving the date of ordination, the name of the ordaining bishop and a request to pray for the candidate, their family, and the place in which they will serve. That custom isn't so much known in the High Westmorland Benefice but please do pray for the candidates as they prepare not only for a special day but for a lifetime of service. You may like to use this prayer which is a special prayer for ordinands at their ordination:


***Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer
God, you who call your faithful
people into a life of service,
help us to nurture and hold in love
all those who are ordained at this
time in the life of your Church.
Teach us your ways,
that we might recognise your
Mission in the world,
your compassion in caring for
others, and your love deep within
every human heart.
We ask this in your Holy Name,
as one undivided Trinity of love,
now and for evermore.
Amen.***

Brilliant achievement by Ross of Tebay!



Last August, Ross Jenkin took on a massive challenge: to be the first person ever to complete the Big 4 UK mountain running challenges back to back, all within one week. (He called it "The Big 4 at 40".) They are The Paddy Buckley Round in Snowdonia, The Denis Rankin Round in the Mountains of Mourne in Northern Ireland, The Charlie Ramsay Round in the Ben Nevis range, Scotland, and The Bob Graham Round in the English Lake District – totalling approximately 400km, 32,000m of ascent, 152 peaks and over 100 hours of mountain running.

Last year things didn't quite go according to plan – weather and injury stopped him, with gale force winds on the knife edge ridges of the Ring of Steel in Scotland, and the excruciating pain of extreme tendonitis bringing the attempt to a slow and devastating stop at the end of the Paddy Buckley in Snowdonia.

Sunday 13th June this year saw Ross starting a second attempt – a little older (but still 40!), a little wiser, and ready to take on the challenge for a second time. It was tough, it hurt - a lot, but with an amazing support team of about 70 people from all round the country, running with him, or giving road support, not least his courageous wife, Maria, Ross has achieved this world-first success.

At 2 a.m. on Sunday 20th June he ran up to the door of the Keswick Moot Hall—exhausted, but triumphant, and pretty emotional with it! His small crowd of supporters cheered, as he hugged his almost equally exhausted wife. **Well done, Ross! We're so proud of you!**

Covid Vaccinations update

We are no longer giving first vaccines here at the Surgery. We have now attempted to contact all patients who are due their second vaccines. If anyone feels they may have been missed then they need to contact us urgently.

The following information is on our website:

COVID vaccination certification

We are unable to issue this certificate at the practice. Please see the Gov.uk website for further information.

Proof of your vaccination status will be available on the **NHS app**, which is also valuable for accessing your health records and ordering repeat prescriptions.

Alternatively, you can call the NHS helpline on 119 and ask for a letter to be posted to you.

This must be at least 5 days after you've completed your course of the vaccine, the letter may take up to 5 days to reach you.

Shingles vaccination

Patients become eligible for routine vaccination against shingles when they become 70 years of age and all those aged up to and including 79 years are now eligible to receive the vaccine until they become 80 years of age. Individuals who were eligible for the Shingles vaccination programme who turned 80 years during the COVID-19 pandemic and missed the opportunity to be vaccinated, either due to lockdown or because they were shielding at home and unable to attend their general practice, can continue to be vaccinated up to 31st July 2021.

Some telephone and video appointments can be pre-booked online, otherwise contact the surgery at 8.30am to arrange one. Surgery attendance for appointments will be kept to a minimum to reduce the risk of infection to our patients.

Please check the NHS 111 website if you are unwell with cough, fever or change in sense of smell or taste symptoms.

MEDICATION

Prescriptions will be available for collection from the Orton Village Hall between 10am and 11am on TUESDAYS. Any not collected will be returned to Shap.

If you have difficulty collecting your prescriptions please let us know. We can arrange delivery or refer to the 'Good Sam' Service for help.

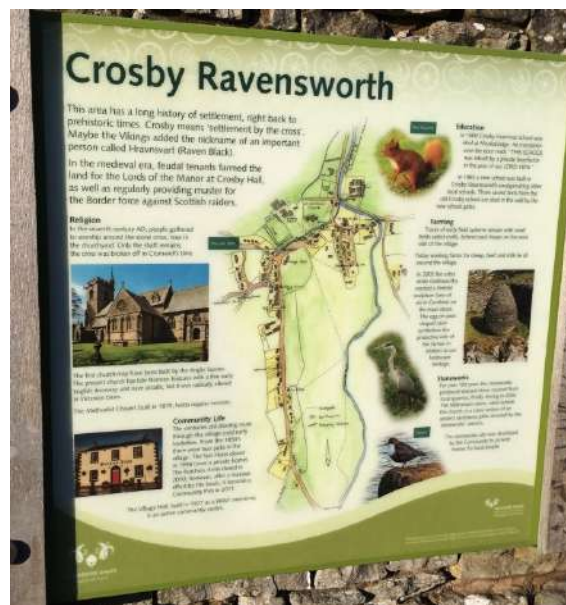

A bit about the yoga:

I will be teaching a Hatha style of yoga. Poses will be combined with breathwork and meditation. Hatha is a slower style of yoga that focuses on alignment. News from All Saints' Church, Kasese, Uganda
(parish linked with All Saints', Orton)

WhatsApp messages from Rev Robert Zziwa and Rev. Nelson Walina, vicar of All Saints' Church, Kasese.

From Robert: 21st May: Here is my 4th child, Elisha, born 9th May, and his elder sister, Rebecca



31st May: I am on my way back to college for studies. We are now in 3rd year, first semester.



From Nelson, 3rd June: My wife Melina (below) is looking after a mango tree that we planted at our garden in memory of our friend Ian

Elliott, whose funeral was Friday 30th April.

We planted this tree on Friday 30th. We shall miss him but keep him in memory for the contributions to us as family and as church in Uganda.



Ian's wife, Ronnie replied: What a lovely thing to do. Thank you. That is very special for me to see.

6th June: We are sending our prayer requests. In Uganda we have encountered the second wave of Covid-19, and lockdown.

The President addressed the nation and has directed the closing of schools, churches, party gatherings etc., for 42 days, beginning with tomorrow. 42 days are two months' salary payments, so you can imagine that prayers are needed.

14th June: The second wave of Covid-19 is very serious. People have hidden in their homes, sales of clothes have been closed.

Compared to the first wave lockdown this is going to affect the church financially more than the last. Yesterday, Sunday, just 6 Christians brought in only 51,000 shillings (about £10).

Kindly pray hard for us because numbers of those tested positive are increasing—72 cases in Kasese alone. You can imagine. We have buried 5 lives.

My Layreader went home for annual leave until lifting of lockdown. We have remained lonely at the church courts with Melina my wife.

We answered: You will all be in our prayers at this morning's Morning Prayer.

He replied: Amen. Thanks in advance. Prayer works. Otherwise we are stranded but I have high hope that God will make us through this situation.

I do remember May 2020, when your Zoom team prayers with you, friends, men and women of God; actually God answered our prayers. Thanks so much for your care.

18th June: The government has ruled no movements for 42 days, both public and private means of transport have been suspended.

This follows the closure of the churches and schools. Many things from today have been closed. Now going to our garden to harvest maize and g-nuts so that we can get food is no way. Melina was to go there tomorrow (*it is some kilometres away*) but she can't now.

As all Christians are in shock, they are not bringing anything to church. (*The weekly church giving by the people is the sole income for the minister.*) Remember the first wave—they could bring something for the church so that we got what we used. I trust God will have to put ways and means to sustain his servants and his flock.

Thanks for your prayers. Our children in Kampala have some flu—we have raised them on phone. They are drinking hot water

Our grandchild (*living with them*) got a bad breathing through the nosals, we took her to clinic in the night hours but she is now breastfeeding.

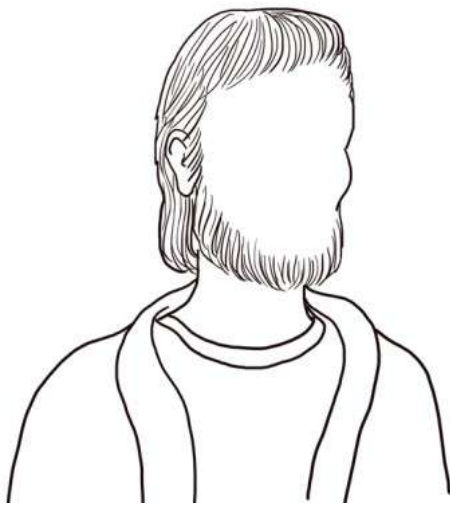

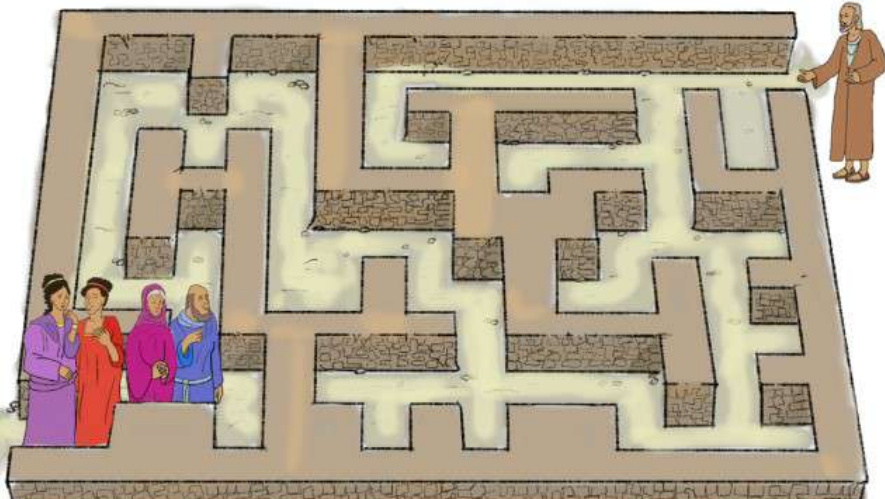

YDMT Climate Change Action Sees 56 New Woodlands Created Across Yorkshire Dales

A [film](#) released by Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust (YDMT) showcases the beauty of new woodlands that have been planted in the fight against climate change thanks to the charity's *Together for Trees* campaign, which is supported by players of People's Postcode Lottery.

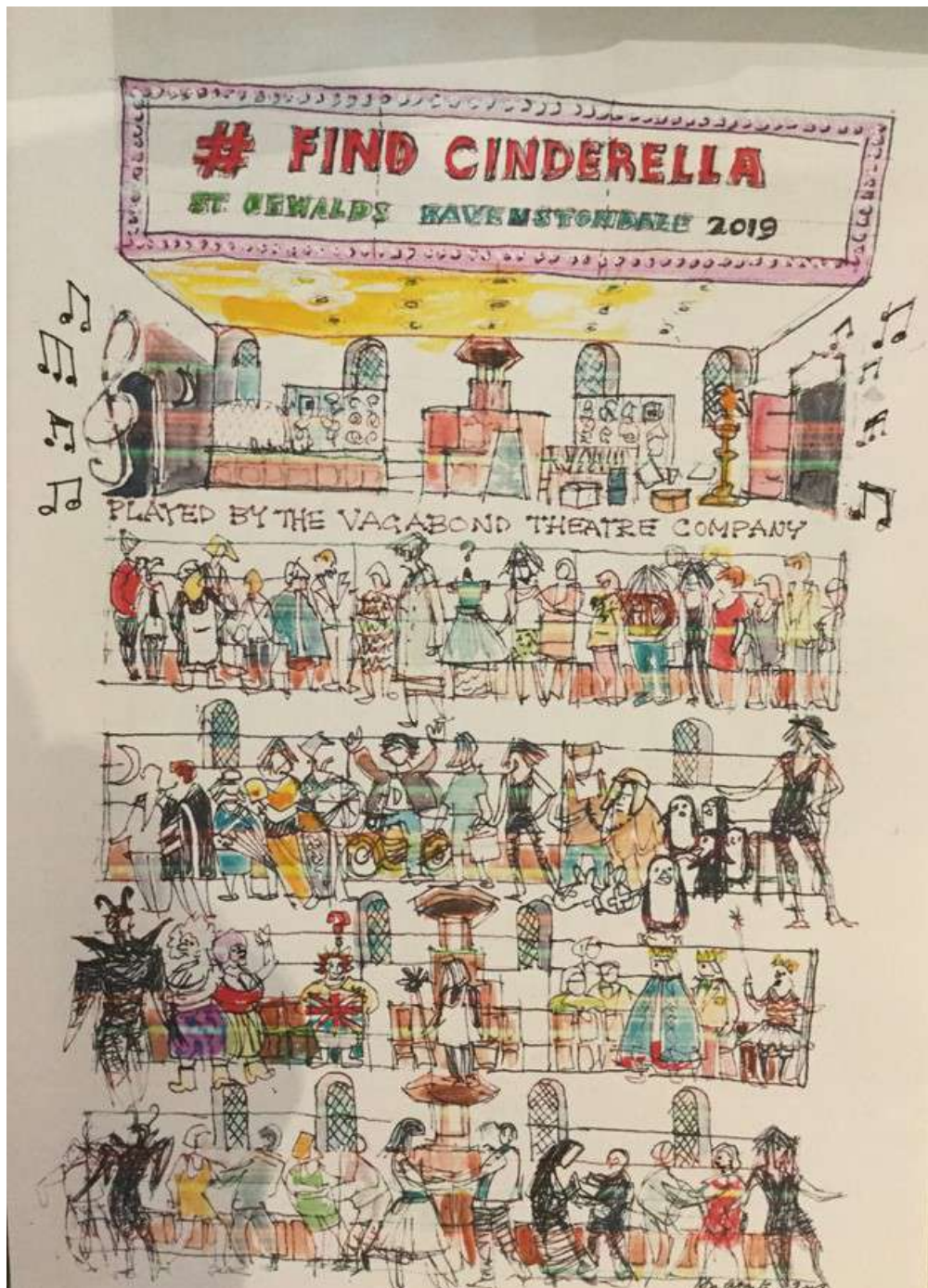

Digging the Past: a community archaeology test pitting project in Ravenstonedale

Are you interested in history or archaeology? Have you ever wondered about the history of your village? If so, then *Digging the Past*, a village test pitting project led by the YDNPA might just be the opportunity you were waiting for! The project is part of the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership scheme and will investigate the village of Ravenstonedale.



It will involve volunteers digging up to thirty small 1x1m test pits around the village. No prior experience is needed and full training will be given. The method used is designed to be

easy for anyone with no prior experience.

The test pits will be supervised by professional archaeologists from the YDNPA and a specialist archaeological contractor,

so relevant expertise will be on hand to guide you and identify what you have found. The test pits are excavated by hand, with the turf carefully removed and spoil stored on sheeting to avoid any mess. Test pits are fully re-



instated and the turf carefully put back upon completion. Even if you are not able or don't wish to dig you can still participate in other ways. For example in helping with processing and washing finds.

The aim is to get volunteers and the local community involved in recovering a range of archaeological finds throughout the village from the topsoil, for example such as pottery sherds. We can then build up a picture of patterns of past activity and learn about the history of how a settlement developed over time. The delivery is being designed to take into account potential restrictions and the ongoing challenges caused by the pandemic.

If you would like to learn more the YDNPA will be excavating a **live demonstration test pit in Ravenstonedale on Saturday the 24th of July 2021 on Glebe Field from 10:30am** (next to St Oswald's Church) which will be open to the public. This will be subject to any restrictions in place at the time and we recommend getting in touch via the information below nearer the time to check the event is still on.

The YDNPA's Community Heritage Officer will also be giving an **online talk on the Digging the Past project on the 1st of September 2021** as part of the WDLP heritage talks series. For details and to book your place see
