

## A CHRISTMAS CAROL – NO, NOT THAT ONE!

The Vagabonds made a triumphant return to St Oswald's Church, Ravenstonedale on 3rd & 4th December with a post-lockdown play which was an intriguing and unlikely blending of Dicken's Christmas Carol and Homer's Iliad - pantomime version.

As well as the Vagabonds themselves, who appeared initially in a Zoom call, it featured – improbably – four ghosts, Cilla Black (given a lorra, lorra love by Anne Asquith), three beautiful (!) goddesses (each actor has requested anonymity to protect his dignity), the best Alan Shearer this side of the Pennines (Steve Fermer), a singing Helen of Troy (Sue Richardson), a special guest appearance by 'Daniel Craig' – and a pantomime cow.



The rather reluctant Greek Chorus (Diana Fothergill and Hilary Law) attempted to tie the story together, and Caroline Morris gave a 'mad woman in the attic' style performance as Cassandra, regularly reminding everyone that 'We are all doomed!'.



As Muriel, who had the unenviable job of trying to direct the whole thing, Jill Storrs brilliantly out-Linda-ed Linda Snell. The play was written and directed by Joan Barnard, who is now very relieved that 'It's behind you!'



With two sell-out audiences and a busy bar before and after the performances, just over £1200 was raised, split equally between Friends of St Oswald's and 4Eden (formerly Eden Mencap Society)

**Further Histories of Quaker Families in Ravenstonedale** 

#### Revealed at St. Oswald's!

...for the first time in 130 years and unseen by some five generations!!

#### What is revealed?

An historic early 18th Century large oak panelled painted Prayer Board, which can now be seen for the first time since 1891 when it was completely obscured from view by the installation of the Harrison & Harrison (Durham) Organ.

#### Why is it revealed?

Because during the recent works to completely restore the Organ, enough space was created to allow sufficient access to remove the hidden Prayer Board from its hiding place on the Chancel wall behind the Organ and to relocate it to the south wall of the Sanctuary where it can now be seen and appreciated by all.

#### Other reasons?

This Prayer Board (bearing the date 1747) which depicts The Ten Commandments set out in a central panel flanked by Moses and Aaron, is the left hand companion to an almost identically sized Prayer Board which can be seen facing the congregation on the Chancel Wall to the right of the Chancel Arch. This one depicts the Lords' Prayer and Nicene Creed flanked on each side by St. John and St. Peter. As a result of the relocation of the formerly hidden Prayer Board, these two panels now hang 'just around the corner' from each other and are both easily accessible for viewing.

Both these panels date back to the earlier church and they are an important and fascinating part of the atmospheric historical interior of St. Oswald's.



Lancashire Conservation Studios, who are part of Lancashire County Museums Service in Preston, directed the relocation of the hidden Prayer Board and have also assessed the work

> needed to restore both Boards to their best condition.

> Once cleaned and fully restored, they will add even more to the church's visual character.

#### What's the cost of the restoration work?

includes some amounting to £2,000.



#### And there's more

The Monarch's Heraldic Crest of King George II (1727 - 1760) is the third oak panelled board, which although smaller, matches in date and style the other two boards and bears the royal motto "Dieu et mon droit" and which is located on the south wall in the centre of the church opposite the rare three tier pulpit.

At the present time all three boards appear somewhat flat and dull and rather dark due to many years of dirt accumulation but with professional restoration the full colour, vibrancy and indeed the general legibility of each one will be revealed which will be a significant improvement on the visual impact of each one of them.

#### Parry, thrust and an entertaining delve into the History of Castles

The January Ravenstonedale Parish History Group talk welcomed Pete Brummitt, another local speaker who had volunteered to entertain the audience of twenty five members and guests at Newbiggin-on Lune Village Hall.

Declaring at the beginning that his talk 'Curiosities of Castle Design' would be from a non-expert perspective, the talk went on to cover the history of Castle construction, the notable constructors including insight into the current day values of budget and the work of the catering brigade that nourished the Castle residents.

Thanks to historical recipe research and a busy baking session, Pete and Bev Brummitt provided the audience with home-made medieval biscuits (a recipe based on ingredients used around the 13th Century, including saffron, honey, cinnamon and ginger) which perfectly complemented the tea and coffee that traditionally concludes the evening.

An early example of stone construction can be observed in Carlisle. The imposing Carlisle Keep was built in 1092, using stone. The survival today of the Keep exemplifies why construction evolved from wood to stone. Stone construction represented a huge investment in terms of manpower, in one example (Bramber Castle, Sussex) the workforce would be the equivalent today of one hundred persons, working ten hours a day for nine months. In today's value the cost of Conwy Castle would be £40 million. ...shortened in order to fit in the magazine — sorry!

#### Orton Christmas Tree Festival

Most churches have a Christmas Tree at the festive season, but All Saints' Church, Orton, had fourteen!

Local businesses and community groups were invited to take part in the Christmas Tree festival, by decorating a tree with a theme illustrating what they do; and two businesses (Orton Scar Café and Orton Village Stores and Post Office) and eleven local community groups responded.

Children were involved in decorating two of the trees: Charlie's Church (children aged 3 and 4 from Orton School's Nursery and Reception classes) had been learning about angels, God's messengers, and had happy – and messy – fun adorning angel cut-outs with glitter, and their tree was in prime position at the front of church; and Class 3 children, in church to learn how the church prepares for Christmas, decorated the tree near the door.

Other groups who took part were: the Reading Group, Mothers' Union, Bellringers, W.I., Boccia Group, Tiny Hillbillies, Ovarian Cancer, Drop In, Churchyard maintenance team, and Open The Book.

The Festival opened in time for the Christmas Farmers' Market Coffee Morning on 11th December, and

continued until Twelfth Night, 5th January.





Many visitors to church during those weeks commented on beautiful the trees were; and money received, thought to be a direct result of visitors' appreciation of the Christmas Trees (without presumina analyse to donors' motives!) was an extremely encouraging total of about £290.

It is certainly hoped to repeat the project at Christmas 2022.

This has been organised for many years between Tebay and Orton Methodist and Anglican churches.



## Westmorland Dales Apprenticeship Update

Since you last heard from us at the apprentice scheme, we had recently done sphagnum translocation up on the Tebay fell and tree seed collection. Following on from these conservation techniques, we started to learn a fair amount about tree planting.

We first started in Crosby Ravensworth, under the parish's tree project, planting a variety of species such as doa rose, Oak, willow and alder. From the first day, we learnt a variety of ways to plant and guard up trees, mainly the



using tree guards and stakes to protect from potential threats. The main threats to trees are browsing animals, which is the word to describe herbivores that eat woody plants. We then spent our next tree planting days up at Birkett Common, in which we maintained tree guards



to help Rowan trees from falling over and planted hawthorns thickets in around more slow growing trees. This method of planting protects the slower growing trees from browsing species creatures such as deer would much rather eat something other than a spikey hawthorn. At Birkett

there were also some amazing signs of recovery, with the plantations being blocked off from the commoners ground there were early signs of peatland restoration. Since the land had been untouched for so many years.

Me and my colleagues finally rounded off the month by doing two projects. The first project was at Dyke farm, in which we planted with the woodland trust scheme, helping a local farmer to reduce their carbon footprint by planting trees. This project involved planting species like oak, hawthorn, blackthorn, wild cherry and bird cherry. In this project the trees were planted in patches and thickets, to create a wilder look once the trees have grown. The second and final scheme was at Ewelock bank, where we were planting trees but the main goal was to

plant for pollinators. So the trees and shrubs contained spindle, hawthorn, elder, dogwood, blackthorn, hazel and a few oaks. This was planted in a similar way to Birkett, keeping the look of the woodland as wild as possible.



Now that we finished this month, I am excited to say we are now going on to some more exciting work, in January and February. We will then be tree planting in a years' time where we will hopefully be doing some more tree planting.






## Picturing the Nativity: Painting by Numbers

Appleby Arts Society were given a fascinating and topical lecture for December. Referring to some beautiful paintings from the 14th and 15th centuries, lecturer Shirley Smith showed how the nativity leaend has developed over the years.

According to St Luke's gospel, Mary and Joseph went to Bethlehem, where Jesus was born, but very soon the scene included animals, saints, shepherds, dogs, angels and musical instruments. Were you aware that while his parents were busy, the young Jesus was amusing himself in a baby walker? This was presumably constructed by his carpenter father,

If you study 'The Holy Family at Work', painted by a Master of Catherine of Cleeves in 1440, alongside this article, you will probably be surprised to find that baby walkers had been invented at this time.

Joseph.

'The Institution of the Crib at Greccio', was shown in a fresco by Giotto c 1 2 9 7 and connected to a legend involving St

Francis of Assissi. St Francis is seen carefully lowering The Christ child into a wooden box, representing the manger. Giotto's 'Nativity' shows the ox and ass, several angels on high,

and white sheep representing good, black goats representing bad. In 1383 Bartolo di Fredi's shepherds had brought their dogs with them.

The artist Michael Pacher's magnificent 1481 altarpiece in the church of Sankt Wolfgang in Austria has introduced a shepherd with a lantern, one of the Magi, angels and possibly a midwife. 'The Nativity at Night', c1490 by Geertgen tot sint Jans shows an ox and an ass in the dark stable, with Joseph standing back in the shadows. Through the window behind can be seen tiny shepherds on a far hill, and an angel in the sky.

Figures changed in paintings from southern Europe and the north, and it was interesting to compare the images of the Christ child. Those from the south tended to be plump, those from the north skinny.

In 'Virgin and Child before a Firescreen' (Robert Campin 1440) the Virgin is shown breastfeeding.

Images of Mary's birth, pregnancy and marriage were shown in order to humanise the Virgin, but Joseph's doubt about the expected birth is shown in 'Doubt of Joseph' 1430.

However by far the most touching image, by an unknown artist, is of Joseph cutting up his socks to clothe the new baby.

What a lot of changes since we first heard of the birth of Jesus in a manger, images

intended to bring these scenes into a world with which man could identify. Pictures were the books of the unlettered.

#### Pause for reflection

We continue to live with uncertainty, as we have for much of the last two years.

Even as we are promised that 'omicron' is reducing, we continue to face the unknown hoping for things to get 'back to normal', but still anxious for ourselves, for loved ones, and still remembering the losses we experienced.

Living through the last two years has taught us that we have to hold our plans lightly, and to have a range of possibilities in view — as individuals, as churches and as communities. And our experience of doing that is that it is exhausting.

Most trauma is short and sharp, with long lasting effects. The pandemic, working through the Greek alphabet as it does, is drawn out trauma. with effects just as long lasting. How can we look forward with hope?

In John's Gospel, chapter 14. Jesus tells his disciples, fearing his death, that they know the way to the place where he is going.

Thomas says "We do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?"

Jesus reminds them of a figure they would know well: the "dragoman". Dragomen were guides for journeys. They knew the way to the destination, and you were safe in their hands.

Jesus tells Thomas "I am the way." Jesus is the dragoman.

We may not know what will happen as we continue into 2022, and have to cope with its uncertainties and fears. Jesus says "I am your

dragoman."

You will know you are in my hands.

#### Kendal Debt Centre launch

More than 100 people gathered for the official launch of a new Christians Against Poverty debt centre to serve people in Kendal and the surrounding area. The Kendal and District Debt Centre has come about through a collaboration of churches in the town, with the launch event held at St Thomas' Kendal on Sunday night.

Referrals will be made centrally by CAP and are open to everyone. The event saw the commissioning of the debt centre's new manager Samantha Vyner-Brooks. The Rev Jonny Gios, chair of Trustees, paid tribute to the work of a previous debt centre in the town at Parr Street Evangelical Church which closed in 2019, after helping 78 families go debt-free. He added: "We are passionate about seeing lives transformed, renewed and set free from debt right across the South Lakes area. After two years of hard work by many individuals and churches, now the work really begins with our first client due to be seen on Tuesday."





#### The Liberal Club - Orton

Last month we looked at Petty Hall so it seems right that we should look at the Liberal Club that stands in, what was, the grounds of Petty Hall.



As a Liberal supporter Dr. Robert Gibson donated a plot of land, at the front side of Petty Hall, for a club house to be built. Unfortunately he died before the completion of the building so never saw its completion.

It was to be built by public subscription and all of the stone was donated by Mr. Robert Clark of Orton. The foundation stone was laid by Lord Hothfield in March 1887 who had contributed £20.00 to the building fund. It was described as "a neat little structure, without any pretentions to architectural grandeur, well finished internally, and stands in the centre of the village where it is likely to become a useful and popular place of resort during the long winter evenings."



It was officially opened by Sir Wilfred Lawson in October 1888 when a public meeting was held in a packed Temperance Hall.

In 1974 Kathleen Gibson bought the building and land it stood on and from the estate of Dr Richard Gibson, her husband, who had allowed the property to be used during his lifetime as a Youth Club. And on the 16th July 1974, by deed of Conveyance, she handed it to the trustees of the village for use again by the Youth Club.

When the Youth Club was no longer required the Liberal Club it was returned to the ownership of the Gibson family. The Gibson family have since sold the property and it has been turned into a one-bedroom residence.

I have always wondered who carved the stone above the door. It looks like the work of William Wilson, but he was already dead by 1887 but as he worked as a stone mason at Crosby Ravensworth maybe it was carved by one of his fellow workers. Do you know?

#### **Covid Vaccinations update**

We are no longer giving first vaccines here at the Surgery. We have now attempted to contact all patients who are due their second vaccines. If anyone feels they may have been missed then they need to contact us urgently.

The following information is on our website:

#### **COVID** vaccination certification

We are unable to issue this certificate at the practice. Please see the <u>Gov.uk website</u> for further information. Proof of your vaccination status will be available on the **NHS app**, which is also valuable for accessing your health records and ordering repeat prescriptions. Alternatively, you can call the NHS helpline on 119 and ask for a letter to be posted to you. This must be at least 5 days after you've completed your course of the vaccine, the letter may to take up to 5 days to reach you.

#### **Shingles vaccination**

Patients become eligible for routine vaccination against shingles when they become 70 years of age and all those aged up to and including 79 years are now eligible to receive the vaccine until they become 80 years of age. Individuals who were eligible for the Shingles vaccination programme who turned 80 years during the COVID-19 pandemic and missed the opportunity to be vaccinated, either due to lockdown or because they were shielding at home and unable to attend their general practice, can continue to be vaccinated up to 31st July 2021.

#### Seasonal flu/Covid booster vaccination information:


This year the Practice will be contacting all eligible patients for their flu vaccination and likely Covid booster to be given at the same time.


