#### Where were YOU in '52?

To be honest, I can't remember much about the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II but I can remember the day she ascended to the throne (although I had no idea what 'a sended' was).

I had started school only a few weeks before and was in the lowest of the low infant class which meant we had to sit at the front when the whole school assembled in the hall. It was a huge school by today's standards, there were over a hundred in my age group and about three hundred infants altogether.

The head teacher Miss Bloomfield stood in front of us and told us that the king had died and we were all to go home for the rest of the day. Just like that, hats and coats on and out of the door.

Imagine doing that today, bearing in mind that some of us were only four years old! My friend Jimmy and myself wandered home with a huge gang of children of all ages who lived near each other, the older ones answering our questions about what a king was and did he live in a castle and was he very old and would there be a war to find out who was the next king?

Jim and I first went to our house but there was nobody in so we strolled along the back lane to his place. There was nobody in there either but Jimmy had a key on a string round his neck so

he opened the door and we went in to search for biscuits. After satisfying our hunger we were playing in the back yard when his mum appeared with her shopping. Remember in those days nobody had fridges so meat and dairy products had to bought fresh daily.

'What are you two doing here? she asked 'Why aren't you at school?'

'We got sent home mam, the king's died'.

'Don't be so daft' his mum shouted 'Get your coats on and I'll take you back'

Of course, the news travelled like wildfire by word of mouth, so much so that as we were dragged protesting along the road, many adults were outside

We hoped we might stay off school until there was a new king but it was not to be and life carried on as normal.

I suppose we had some sort of celebration for the coronation but I can't remember anything about it. I lived on the Durham/ Northumberland border and it all seemed a long way remote from London. I did have a Coronation mug and a Matchbox toy Golden Coach but they disappeared over the years.

# Shrove Tuesday



#### Where did the tradition come from?

During Lent early Christians used to 'abstain from flesh meat and from all things that come from flesh, as milk, cheese, eggs', as ordered by Pope Gregory the Great in AD 600.

Shrove Tuesday is the day before the start of Lent and was traditionally a day for using up food which was not eaten throughout Lent into pancakes, hence Pancake Tuesday.

As well as pancakes, there are many traditions associated with the day, probably the most famous being the many Mardis Gras festivals held in many countries (Mardis Gras is 'Fat Tuesday' in French).

In the UK there are the Shrove Tuesday 'mob football' games, usually involving two teams

defined by living in different parts of a town. The most famous is probably held at Ashbourne in Derbyshire, but other games take place at both Alnwick and Sedgefield in the North East, Atherstone on Warwickshire and St Columb Major in Cornwall.

Pancake races are held in many places and usually involve the contestants running and tossing a pancake at the same time.

The tradition is said to have started with a housewife from Olney in Buckinghamshire who was making pancakes when she heard the church bells ringing to signify the start of the church service.

She ran to church carrying her frying pan,

tossing the pancake in the air to stop it burning.

At Scarborough in Yorkshire the seafront roads are closed to traffic, schools close early and the townsfolk, young and old, are all invited to skip, using long ropes from the nearby harbour. This is followed by traditional pancake races.

In parts of Ireland it was traditional for the eldest unmarried daughter to toss the first pancake. If the pancake finished on the floor then she would remain unmarried for the next year.

However you enjoy your pancakes, whether it's the traditional way, with lemon juice and sugar, or whether you're making savoury pancakes, spare a thought for the meaning behind the pancake!

#### Platinum Jubilee Plans

This will be our only opportunity to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee and the Queen's amazing reign.

Therefore, Orton Parish Council, the Parochial Church Council, Orton School, Tebay W I, the Market Hall committee and various villagers have put together an exciting programme of events. All members of Orton parish and our neighbouring parishes are welcome to join in and enjoy.

A team has been put together to decorate the village starting on 19th May. Individuals are encouraged to decorate their own homes, the theme will be red, white and blue and of course the Union Jack.

The **church exhibition** will have a theme of The Queen's Platinum Jubilee and the 1950's and will run for two weekends from Saturday 28th May until Sunday 5th June for 9 days. Work has already started.

There will be a return of the famous **Scarecrow Competition** with the Jubilant 50s as the theme. Inspiration may come from the Coronation, Teddy Boys, conquering Everest or other events or trends. We encourage as many as possible to take part in this fun event which is much loved by visitors.

Most of the events take place over the Bank Holiday Weekend which runs from Thursday 2nd June to Sunday 5th June. The following is an outline of the plans and additions or changes may follow.

#### Our plans so far...

#### Saturday 28th May the Parish Boundary Walk.

This is a marvellous 30 mile route around one of the largest parishes in the country. In parts it rises to well over 2000 feet and presents an excellent challenge to a fit walker or runner. For the less athletic, the route can be divided into three more manageable sections each over superb walking country. Further details and maps will be made available in due course. Reasonable weather is required for the full walk and if Saturday 28th May proves to be unsuitable it can hopefully be completed on the reserve date of Saturday 11th June.

Over the four day Bank Holiday weekend the events will be announced by the Village Crier, Neville from the shop.

We will start on Thursday 2nd June with the Royal Proclamation at 1.00 pm following a peal of the church bells.

At around 7:15pm there will be a Gather at the Market Hall where we will toast the Queen and a piper will play. We will then walk (or drive) up to the Beacon Monument on Orton Scar where the piper will play the music prepared for the Jubilee (The Diu Regnare) at 9.09pm followed by the lighting of our beacon at 9:15pm. The beacon will form part of a nationwide chain of beacons which it is hoped will be largest and most dramatic ever seen. The lighting will followed beacon be by a 70 rocket salute.

On Friday 3rd June there will be an equestrian event. A Jubilee themed village ride commencing at 2:00pm.

On Saturday 4th June there will be sports and other activities on the School Field.

On Sunday 5th June at 1:30pm a Street Party/Big Picnic will take place in the centre of the village by the Market Hall. You are invited to bring and share food and drink and there will be live music.

Steve Crook will create a photographic record of the events and after the past two years, we feel that the emphasis should be on enjoying ourselves rather than fundraising.

#### Notes from the Herald January, 1922

Snow free 1-2 January, then 16 degrees F (6C) drop on 3rd, blizzards. Gone by 14th – fog, back by 24th. Flu in Penrith.

Foot and Mouth in N. Cumberland, Kendal and Ambleside brought by Irish cattle via Silloth in late January.

Orton's annual Temperance Festival teas in the Temperance Hall on 1st January (talks, singing, food etc.).

Tebay Church Sunday School tea and prizegiving at New Year.

Ravenstonedale's Wesleyan Sunday School Tea party on New Year's Eve.

Mrs. Mary Beck. Widow of Mr. Edward Beck, (landowner, died in 1891) died in Ravenstonedale aged 94 (report 25th February, 1922).

Vast famine in Russia. A General Election expected soon in UK. Trains are still slow, scarce and dear as in recent war.

Fine till late March, then blizzards. BST returned on 26th (snow).

Orton Wesleyan Chapel is to erect a new Sunday School and to renovate and re-seat the Chapel. Tenders to their architect, Mr. J. Knewstubb (Penrith) by 5th April. In 1853 at Eskew Bank, Orton, Elizabeth Atkinson was born. In 1879 she and George her brother, migrated to the USA where in 1880 she wed Mr. James Dinsdale; he died in 1914. He lived at Buckingham, US. She then went to live with her daughter Mrs. P.D. Schmidt where she died recently, age not given. Of her 11 siblings, 3 brothers and 3 sisters are still alive (one brother is Mr. Thomas Atkinson of Warcop; the other 5 are in the USA. She died of pneumonia. Died at Eskew Bank, Greenholme, on 10th, Mrs. Jane Jackson, 66, big funeral on Tuesday, 14th. Her husband William was of Scale Gill and she was the only daughter of the late Mr. John Dinsdale, Eskew Bank.

Tebay: Football, Westmorland Cup, 2nd Round: Kendal Town 1, Tebay 0. Died at Gt. Asby, no date said, Phoebe, wife of Thomas Atkinson, ex Tebay. She was 48 and buried at Gt. Asby on 11th

Ravenstonedale celebrated the Royal Wedding of Princess Mary to Viscount Lascelles with tea for all ladies over 60 at Lady and Miss Fletcher's White House early in March. Twenty came; those who were ill each had a basket of cakes sent to them. Newbiggin-on-Lune School pupils each got an orange and bag of sweets given by Mrs Fothergill of Brownber.

On Friday 24th Ravenstonedale's ex-soldiers put on a concert in the Endowed School, followed by supper and dance. A lot there. The Band of Hope meets monthly on Mondays. William Potter, builder of Ravenstonedale, established over 100 years is the contractor for the Oxenholme and Kirkby Stephen

housing schemes. (Advert) He also sells building materials. Mr. And Mrs. Alderson, Kilnmire Farm, pillars of local Wesleyan Methodism, are off to Catherine Holme near Appleby. There was a presentation to them in The Wesleyan Chapel (report 18th March.

150 years ago, March 1872. A Capper of Orton -

We have a widower in Penrith aged 94 who can challenge Orton's oldest to walk, run or work faster than him (Orton's oldest person had just died aged 97). The Editor and the Orton correspondent were in friendly rivalry for years, each seeking to "cap" i.e. go one better than the other.

You might feel a need to give something back to your local community or have spare time and would like to use it to do something worthwhile – whatever your reason for becoming a responder, it is something that will be both rewarding and, at times, challenging.

The satisfaction of becoming a responder is not just based on saving someone's life, although this is a very special moment should it ever arise. When someone calls an ambulance they are unwell, possibly frightened or unsure of what is happening and vulnerable. Even when dealing with a patient who is not seriously ill, you have the opportunity to calm and reassure them.

Talking to them and supporting them while they wait for an ambulance is a part of the responder role that is often forgotten or overlooked but it can often be the most rewarding part.



We will train you to respond to emergencies but you can still go about your normal routine. If we need your help, we will alert you!

We'll never knowingly send you to an incident where there is any risk or danger to yourself. You'll help patients who are suffering with chest pains, having breathing difficulties, in diabetic emergencies, in cardiac arrest, or who are unconscious or fitting.

You'll need to be caring and calm under pressure – you really could make the difference between life and death.

#### **Tebay Conservative Club**

It is 1889 and Tebay has expanded beyond all recognition. The railways had come in 1846 and up the road from Old Tebay many houses had been built to hold the railway workers and their families. Clubs had formed, a Church and Chapel had been built but some of the men wanted a place where those of the same political persuasion could meet and this came in the form of The Tebay Conservative Working Men's Club.

Mr John Farrer of Lambrigg Foot donated a 170 square yard plot of land in Mount Pleasant, for the building of the club and Mr Richard Brunskill of Gaisgill drew up the plans. It was to be a plain and substantial stone building and £210 had been raised for its construction. Mr John story had the contract for the masonry and Mr. T. Bousefield was responsible for the carpentry and it was to be built from local rag stone with granite dressings. The far end of the building was to be used as a reading room and the large room as a billiard room.



The building was duly completed on budget and the elected secretary, Mr G.S. Sedgwick, and his committee arranged for a grand opening In May 1890. The Tebay brass band paraded through the town playing lively airs and a large crowd had assembled to await the arrival of Mr. Lowther and Colonel Burn of Orton who were to perform this.

Colonel Burn, in a few appropriate words, invited Mr Lowther to formally open the club, which he did and then invited members in to a meeting chaired by Colonel Burn. During Mr Lowther's speech he said he trusted that the Tebay Conservative Club would be useful in various ways and that it would be used for many purposes. In conclusion he expressed a hope that the new club would be a great success, and that it would be a means of teaching the people of the town the true facts relating to political questions.

The afternoon concluded with sports being held and tea provided by ladies of Tebay. In the evening a concert, supper and dance were held in the Market Hall presided over by Mr Metcalfe Gibson.

Now, of course, this building is still standing but as a private residence.

We're putting on two dates at Maulds Meaburn and Kirkby Stephen.



# Westmorland Dales Apprenticeship Update

Over the course of this month we have been very busy chain sawing. We have been practicing chainsawing at Waitby link as well as our workshop in Tebay. We have learned about the basic maintenance of a chainsaw, crosscutting as well as small tree felling.

We started off our course at Brigsteer woods in Cumbria where we learned the correct cuts and the proper way to fell a tree. We also learned the correct crosscutting techniques at our office in Tebay with our apprentice supervisor Belinda Lloyd.



We have been taught how to figure out tension in a log and the right way to release tension. We have been removing a lot of the Ash dieback off the old railway line at Waitby link, making sure to use our newly developed skills to fell the Ash to land in the right direction, crosscutting our felled trees and stacking the logs for firewood.

Over the course of this month I have learned the basic knowledge of chainsaw maintenance

which normally consists of maintenance of the bar and keeping the chain sharp. And being able to keep the chainsaw clean and being able to check for any damage.



I also have learnt an appropriate amount of felling cuts and can tell if a tree is heavily leaning and can figure out which cut would be needed to fell it safely and land in the right direction. We also learnt how to remove a hung up tree safely.

I enjoyed the chainsaw course and hope to pass the assessment and enjoyed working with landowners and hope to put my new skills to work very soon.

#### Artemisia Gentileschi – Daughter of Rome, Painter of Europe

It was good to see that Appleby Art Society's February lecture was very well supported, as our lecturer, Chantal Brotherton- Ratcliffe had come from London to talk to us about that rare thing, a respected woman artist in the time of Caravaggio. Artemisia Gentileschi (1593-c1656) is considered among the most accomplished seventeenth-century artists. In 1616 she was first woman to gain membership to the Academy of the Arts of Drawing.

The Gentileschi family lived in Rome, her father Orazio being what we might call a 'B list' artist. Artemisia's mother died early leaving four young children, and it naturally fell to Artemisia to look after her brothers and the home as well as helping mix the pigments and prepare everything for Orazio.

Somehow Artemisia found time to paint. In 1610 she painted the Bible story of 'Susanna and the Elders', the men spying on Susanna as she bathed in a pool.



Like her male counterparts she tackled big historical and biblical subjects, with her own distinctive style. At the age of 17, Artemisia was raped by the painter Agostino Tassi. Her father took Tassi to court to prove Artemisia's innocence, as by the conventions of Rome she was now unmarriageable. After an infamous trial in 1612, Tassi was found guilty. Artemisia was immediately married to a Florentine and went to live in Florence where no-one would know her. In Florence she had a better life, and was able to establish herself as an independent artist. Her work became extremely sought-after.

In 1613 she painted 'The Penitent Magdalene', and another of her best known subjects, also from the Bible, 'Judith Beheading Holofernes', where she had no qualms about portraying the full gory spectacle of the blood dripping from Holofernes's head. 'St Catherine of Alexandria', one of Artemisia's self-portraits, was bought by the National Gallery in 2018, and 'The Allegory of Painting', painted in London when she visited the court of Charles 1st, is now in The Royal Collection Trust.



She returned to Naples c 1630 where she painted two altar pieces for the Spanish court. In 1638/39 she was in London and painted several pictures for Charles 1st. She lived in Naples until her death at around 1656.

People also give to charity, set aside time to study the bible and meet with other Christians to reflect on Jesus' life and prepare for the events of Holy Week and Easter.


You might like to use this prayer as you start the season of Lent and prepare for Easter.

You can find that, and more, in John's Gospel.









This must be at least 5 days after you've completed your course of the vaccine, the letter may to take up to 5 days to reach you.

#### Shingles vaccination

Patients become eligible for routine vaccination against shingles when they become 70 years of age and all those aged up to and including 79 years are now eligible to receive the vaccine until they become 80 years of age. Individuals who were eligible for the Shingles vaccination programme who turned 80 years during the COVID-19 pandemic and missed the opportunity to be vaccinated, either due to lockdown or because they were shielding at home and unable to attend their general practice, can continue to be vaccinated up to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2021.

#### Seasonal flu/Covid booster vaccination information:

This year the Practice will be contacting all eligible patients for their flu vaccination and likely Covid booster to be given at the same time.


