Gracious, Noble, Devout



Whether you are an ardent royalist, a reluctant or surprised one like me, or convinced that we need a republic, over this past two years, during this pandemic, the Queen has given some of the most profound broadcasts.

To my mind she has knocked spots of politicians and many religious leaders, managing to talk with profound faith and humanity, expressing the essential unity of a people who belong to one another and share a common experience. She is a remarkable woman and has served her realm with distinction for 70 years.

I have never known another monarch and when the day comes to change the response from 'O Lord save the Queen' to 'O Lord save the King', it will take me a while to get used to it. I think there will be a sense of having lost probably the most stable anchor of our national life. She is the nations' granny and has the personal respect of so many people. It is the quality of who she is that has provided a stable sense of national life when politicians divide and have been found wanting at different times. We should not underestimate the value of this figurehead and the power to set a tone.

If you asked me to say what my democratic, analytical brain says, I would come down firmly on an elected head of state.

How can anyone justify hereditary government or head of state? But, and it is an enormous 'but', no politician will gather the crowds, win allegiance, capture the hearts and minds like a loved monarch does. She stands as someone who transcends the political landscape and that seems to make a difference which doesn't fit my logic. I find the royals, at their best, understand the lives of their people more than those who are directly elected often seem to.

The Duke of Edinburgh and the Prince of Wales were exploring environmental concerns long before it became trendy and Prince William has taken up the baton. The Duke of Edinburgh awards scheme and the Prince's Trust have both made a difference to so many young lives.

In April 2020, with the nations still in lockdown, she spoke in a special broadcast about who we are not

being a part of our past but defining our present and our futures. She spoke at Christmas that year about being inspired by the kindness of strangers, as with the Good Samaritan.

The Queen has not been shy about her faith. If there are times we are, we can taken inspiration from her. She has repeatedly described the teachings of Jesus as the 'bedrock' of her faith and her 'inner light'. She said in 2002:

"I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God... I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel."

We give thanks for a life of service and stability for this nation. It is a remarkable offering, sanctified in the anointing at the coronation and in the quality of character which has been displayed over that time. It is a gift given we would probably never have invented given the chance. Gracious, noble, glorious, devout and stable; it is right to join in with the nation to say 'thank you' in this platinum celebration year.

One depicting The Ten Commandments flanked by portraits of Moses and Aaron had been hidden from view behind the Organ for 130 years is now in full view for all to see on the south wall of the Sanctuary.

Alexander, has international status as an organist performing throughout the UK, Europe, USA and Asia.

He was appointed organist of Cheltenham College in 2004 after a three year tenure as Director of Music at St Catherine's College, Cambridge.

Throughout his time at Cheltenham he has given recitals regularly, featuring in Cheltenham International Music Festival and also on BBC Radio 3 broadcasts.

Alexander has close family roots in Ravenstonedale... he practised his organ playing on the St Oswald's Harrison in his childhood and is delighted to have the opportunity to play the fully restore instrument!

Historic Prayer Board **Restoration... Progress !!**

At St Oswald's we're delighted to report that following on from the article Revealed at St Oswald's !" which appeared in the February 2022 Issue of The Link, the long awaited restoration work on the first of three large painted oak panelled boards has begun.

This delicate, intricate and time consuming restoration work began on 4th April



with the '130 years hidden' board, which depicts the text of The Ten Commandments flanked with life size portraits of Moses and Aaron.

Even after only gentle initial cleaning, the text, the figures of Moses and Aaron and the vibrancy of original colouration are beginning to appear and be revealed to dramatic effect.

This exciting project will continue throughout April and May.

A Celebration of Parish Partnership

Over 30 people attended Jackie Wedd's talk to Ravenstonedale Parish History Group (RPHG) on 16th March 2022 entitled More About the Millennium Map, its Companion Book, the four Parish Embroideries, and of course not forgetting...the Tea Towel! This was a sequel to Jackie's talk shown via Zoom in February 2021, which focussed on the creation of the Parish's Millennium Map, and this time Jackie featured the four Parish Embroideries made between 1997 and 2000, reuniting them with some of their creators for the evening.

However, before explaining the design process and execution of these beautiful embroidered works of art by over twenty people over two years, Jackie tied up a few loose ends left over from her previous talk. Strange though it seems to us now, it is indeed true that signalmen on quieter railway lines often supplemented their wages with odd jobs in their signal box in between trains – this could include giving a "short back and sides" to local men, and a 1950s photo from the RPHG Parish archive shows grateful customers entering and leaving the signal box after their short walk from the platform for their haircuts!

Perhaps the most intriguing story from the Map concerns the burial cave nicknamed The Wolf Den. After her first talk Jackie was approached by two local residents who, guite by chance, had witnessed and photographed an archaeological investigation of the cave in 1997, the subject of an episode in the BBC series Meet the Ancestors (no longer available) and of a chapter in the book of the same name, written by archaeologist and presenter Julian Richards. The archaeologists were kind enough to take their camera down into the cave to photograph the finds - human bones, wolf bones, bones from wolf prey such as red and roe deer, and well-preserved footprints in the floor of the cave made by two young children some time before 1400 AD. The couple offered these photos to RPHG for copying for the Parish archive and agreed to let Jackie use them in her talk.

The human bone fragment retrieved from the cave on an earlier occasion by cave divers had been carbon-dated to the Middle Bronze Age i.e. between 1520 and 1395 BC, and it was assumed that a partial skull found in 1997 (and later returned to the cave to be laid to rest once more) which was used to reconstruct a woman's head and features, came from the same era. But after carbon-dating, this ancestor proved to be from the later Romano-British time, between 80 and 210 AD, and some deer bones were dated to between 1190 and 1400AD. The cave is now sealed once more and its exact location is not in the public domain.

Also in 1997, a collaborative effort began to plan, design and execute four seasonal embroidered panels to portray aspects of Parish life. They are usually housed separately in current and former places of worship in the Parish and only seen together at an Advent service each December when they are exchanged between venues. Design sketches, sources used, photographs of planning meetings and detailed notes of the materials and methods were also on display for the evening, taken from the Parish archive.

Jackie was able to contact several of the participants while researching the project during lockdown, and had face-to-face meetings with some of them after restrictions were lifted. Without exception they remembered the project as a very happy time and really enjoyed being involved, "even if at times the execution of it seemed rather daunting" as one remarked!

Signatures of all the Ravenstonedale School pupils from the year 2000 are embroidered round the edges of the panels and these children also feature on the School Millennium tea towel – not only their signatures but their self-portraits, and their drawings of the staff and helpers!

The talk took the audience on a journey of discovery about Ravenstonedale Parish which ranged from 1520 BC to 2000 AD, and celebrated two collaborative Parish Millennium projects.

The next RPHG talk will be presented by Dr Les Neal, and will cover the history of the early Quaker families in Ravenstonedale.

At the most recent meeting of our Parochial Church Council, it was unanimously agreed that all the proceeds from the forthcoming Orton Church Exhibition should go towards the work which needs to be done on the tower (as documented in last month's Link magazine).

Celebrating the Jubilant 50s in Orton

To celebrate HM The Queen's Platinum Jubilee, the Orton community is planning for the return of its Scarecrow Festival and Church Exhibition at the end of May and the theme is the Jubilant 50s.

At the heart of the Exhibition in All Saints' Church will be a Scarecrow Street Party with all the guests, as well as the cakes and trimmings you would expect, made by a team of village residents.

Helen Wearmouth is one of those involved in planning the Scarecrow Street Party: "Visitors have enjoyed seeing our Scarecrow Wedding and Four Seasons in the past so a Street Party with about 40 Scarecrow guests seemed ideal for the Jubilant 50s theme. We're busy sewing a huge range of cakes – the target is to make 200 if we can - and ensuring that every Scarecrow is well dressed for the occasion. The plan is to have one side of the aisle in 50s costume and the other side in today's style."



"Other parts of the Exhibition with celebrate different aspects of the Jubilee and life in the Jubilant 50s while the scarecrows around the village will interpret the theme in different ways, often with a lot of humour if past years are anything to go by!"

"We're hoping to have all sorts of Royal connections in the Exhibition," says Church Warden, Chris Bland. "Visitors will be able to see a Coronation, complete with figures representing HM The Queen, the Archbishop of Canterbury and other distinguished guests as well as lots of other displays. We hope visitors will enjoy both the formality of the great occasion and the fun and laughter of the street party."

The Exhibition and Scarecrow trail will run from Saturday 28 May to Sunday 5 June around Orton with refreshments served in All Saints Church each day. Maps of the Scarecrow trail will be available in Church and from Orton Village Store and all proceeds will go to All Saints' Church.

My memories of the Coronation in June 1953

I was 16 when the Queen was crowned; our boarding school (Shrewsbury School) of course gave us several days' holiday, and so our family – my mother and two of my elder brothers – decided to go to London to see the procession.

We arrived in East Carriage Drive, part of Park Lane, which was on the route, at about 3 a.m., in the hope of being near enough the front of the crowd to get a good view. We found a few rows of people in front of us, who had been there all night! Because I was tall I could still see well.

It was raining steadily virtually the whole day. I was wearing a smart white shirt with a blue tie, with crowns all over it; by the end of the day the blue dye had run all over the shirt collar!

The crowds went on gathering, although there would be nothing to see until the afternoon. One early excitement was posters advertising the day's newspapers, with the headline, "EVEREST CONQUERED!" In fact Sir Edmund Hilary and Sherpa Tenzing had arrived at the summit – the first people ever to do so – a fortnight earlier, but it had been kept secret until the news could be given to the Queen as a Coronation present!

There were loudspeakers on all the trees, and a running commentary of all that was going on was being broadcast. At last we heard that the young queen had left the Palace for Westminster Abbey. We heard all the trumpet fanfares, and the whole service in the Abbey was broadcast to the crowds.

At last the procession started – endless ranks of marching soldiers, sailors and airmen from all over the British Empire – as it was then. There were brass bands and pipe bands marching too. It was fascinating to see all the different races and nations and uniforms. The procession went on for over an hour, and the crowds cheered every new troop that appeared. My elder brother was particularly vocal in cheering each different regiment, though what he shouted enthusiastically at the African troops would not have been acceptable nowadays!

Then came a procession of men on horseback, including, I remember, an admiral in his full naval uniform. We thought he looked most uncomfortable! I don't expect admirals ride horses much, especially in the rain, and probably by the time he reached us he was very sore! Then came the open carriages, with all sorts of important people in them. Opposite her in her carriage was some little Maharajah from India – a man who looked tiny beside her, and miserable in the chilly rain, while she smiled and waved to everyone.

As she came past us in her golden coach on that Coronation Day, I am sure she caught my eye, and I wondered if she recognised me from the previous year! (Perhaps not...!)

Later in the day we walked around London to see other sights; there was a marvellous fireworks display after dark, which included a portrait in fireworks of the Queen, Prince Philip, and Prince Charles and Princess Anne, who were 4 and 2.

It was an exhausting but very memorable day.

Notes from the Herald

Cold and wet, frosts daily till 17th and snow on tops on 12th. Deluge on 23rd.

One sixth off the Income Tax, now 5s in £1 (25% of your income). Postage is a quarter cheaper.

Orton had a football team in the Medal Competition at Shap as did Bampton, Crosby Ravensworth and Shap itself. In the final Shap Fell Spars beat Shap Tradesmen 5-4. Fell Pony Show at Shap to choose the champion stallion to travel the Shap, Orton and Bampton area. The prize of £100 went to Heltondale Victor, winner 1920-22.

Tebay marked Hospital Sunday by a procession from Whinfell Terrace through the village, led by the Tebay Brass Band followed by the V.A.D. (medical civilians), Boy Scouts and Sunday Schools collecting as they went by to an open air meeting at Church St. Corner.

Died in Kendal Hospital on 7th, John William, eldest son of Fred and Mary Tindal, Old Tebay; aged 6 he was in hospital for 13 weeks and seemed to be better till meningitis set in. Big funeral. Died at Waskew Head, mid May, the tiny infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Bruton. Born on 4th May she was unable to suck and they fed her on diluted butter and sugar solution.

Ravenstonedale's Wesleyan Chapel Anniversary mid May. Their Sunday School collected £1-19-6d (value today £158) for the starving children in Russia.





Westmorland Dales Apprenticeship Update

This month, as part of the Westmorland Dales apprentice team, I have had my first taster of post and rail fencing. We were fencing as part of a project at Crosby Ravensworth school, to provide an enclosure for the children to plant trees and a hedgerow in, as part of the Crosby Ravensworth Tree Planting Project. We also put in a miniature stile for the children to have easy access to the area we were fencing off, to make sure they could watch the progress of their trees and provide any TLC that may be needed down the line.



None of us on the team had done post and rail fencing (properly) before, and so we were learning the fundamentals on this job, such as how to make sure your fence line is perfectly straight. Plus, Sam (apprentice) got to practice his newly learnt skills from a cable avoidance system course we recently completed.





We also had a fantastic day out in Sedbergh learning about Dippers, the UKs only songbird which feeds underwater. We were educated about their behaviour, their habitat, and what they need from us in terms of conservation. Through this we learned some valuable skills related to monitoring and surveying birds, which we will soon be applying to the wildlife of the Westmorland dales over the spring and summer.



Time is 1030 am to 12 noon.



Punk – the New Aesthetic in Fashion, Art and Music

Punk definition: worthless, bad and inferior person or possibly a harlot or prostitute.

Thus began John Francis' exhilarating lecture at the Wednesday April lecture for Appleby Arts Society. The Punk period was short, from about 1975-1980 and flourished during difficult economic times here. It was the time of the three- day week for example, and the sociologists say that 'it allowed working class youth to restate their opposition to the dominant values and institutions of the time' - and some of us remember it well.

It came from America largely in the wake of teenagers, jeans, leathers and motor bikes and men with Attitude like Brando and James Dean. The word Punk is used in West Side Story in the song "Gee Officer Krupke.....our fathers all are drunks, Golly Moses, naturally we're Punks." (It was difficult not to sing along). The attitude was one of rebellion.

Here, entrepreneur Malcolm McLaren teamed up with dress designer Vivienne Westwood to promote rebellion in clothes, with T shirts carrying shocking messages, ripped jeans, safety pins and boots. Youth added the spiky hair, nose, ear and tongue rings, and from comedian Jo Brand 'Punk allowed women to stop looking feminine - oh the relief.' There was also a thread of Marxism running through the movement, in addition, strangely, to tartan trousers.

Who would have thought that the mundane paper clip would become an icon of rebellion? It came, surprisingly, from Norway where it had been a symbol of resistance in World War Two. It joined the music of the Sex Pistols (who swore for the first time on TV) in promoting outrage and offence. Sid Vicious was part of an influential circle which included Westwood and Jamie Reid whose eye-catching posters proclaimed the anarchy trope. He it was who made the poster of the Queen sporting a safety pin and another which proclaimed 'say it with bricks- a brick will do the trick'. It was one's duty to offend and be subversive.

John Francis concluded by saying that the Punk movement was chiefly an Attitude of Rebellion which ran through everything - clothes, music, art and by the 1980s these had become mainstream. **Think of today's message**-laden T shirts and posters, boots and rap music. Even Royalty have joined in as the Duchess of Cornwall was shown recently wearing a Vivienne Westwood outfit.



Covid Vaccinations update

We are no longer giving first vaccines here at the Surgery. We have now attempted to contact all patients who are due their second vaccines. If anyone feels they may have been missed then they need to contact us urgently.

The following information is on our website:

COVID vaccination certification

We are unable to issue this certificate at the practice. Please see the <u>Gov.uk website</u> for further information.

Proof of your vaccination status will be available on the **NHS app**, which is also valuable for accessing your health records and ordering repeat prescriptions.

Alternatively, you can call the NHS helpline on 119 and ask for a letter to be posted to you. This must be at least 5 days after you've completed your course of the vaccine, the letter may to take up to 5 days to reach you.

Shingles vaccination

Patients become eligible for routine vaccination against shingles when they become 70 years of age and all those aged up to and including 79 years are now eligible to receive the vaccine until they become 80 years of age. Individuals who were eligible for the Shingles vaccination programme who turned 80 years during the COVID-19 pandemic and missed the opportunity to be vaccinated, either due to lockdown or because they were shielding at home and unable to attend their general practice, can continue to be vaccinated up to 31st July 2021.

Seasonal flu/Covid booster vaccination information:

This year the Practice will be contacting all eligible patients for their flu vaccination and likely Covid booster to be given at the same time.

Patients will be contacted in eligibility order and given an appointment time.


We continue to offer COVID vaccinations at the Practice. Please contact us if you are due your booster.




