#### A reflection for February, and beyond...

Our last issue was a double December—January issue, with a healthy focus on Christmas, rather than the New Year, so we're reproducing the recently appointed Bishop of Penrith's New Year message here, with the recognition that what he says is still very relevant to us all as we work through these early months of 2023.

"It's a sad thing, but we used to look forward to new year more than we do now. New year meant a new start, gratitude for what has been, and a commitment to new things.

As we enter 2023, it feels like this hope is missing. Last year's top word was permacrisis, and it feels like we lurch from one challenge to another.

Today, in one of the largest economies in the world, many will go hungry and cold because they cannot afford the basics. Despite all the amazing work that so many people in our communities and churches do to support people, many feel pretty lacking in hope as this new year begins.

For Christians, what do we hold on to? John's gospel speaks of a light shining in the darkness and says that the darkness cannot overcome it. This hope, this light, is a person, Jesus, God with us. God is born in a normal place, into a normal, ordinary family. The Christmas story is special because it is about God joining the ordinary – a place and a family like our own.

And this shows that God cares about the everyday. Each place, each person, is somehow known and special to God. He isn't somewhere else with his phone on do not disturb. Rather, God is there with us in difficult times. He doesn't magically make difficult

stuff go away, or land a million pounds in our lap, much as we might wish he would. But he does give us the strength to step into a new year, whatever challenges it might bring and his love gives us confidence that we are not alone.

Our faith doesn't solve our problems, or protect us from challenge, but it tells us that we are known and loved, that our worth is not in what we have or our success. It tells us that our security lies elsewhere, that we can step into the unknown, putting our hand into the hand of one who loves us and can bear us through any challenge.

As followers of Jesus, we are called each day to bring

something of his healing and his hope to our neighbours in this new year.

May you know His love, His hope and His help this year."

#### Cumbria Winter Warmth Appeal

The annual Winter Warmth Appeal makes sure that older people who may have to choose between heating and eating can stay warm and well throughout the colder months. The significant increase in energy prices and cost of living make the appeal even more important.

Around 300 older people die in Cumbria each year simply because they cannot afford to heat their home properly. In our worst winters, this figure has risen to more than 500. There are fears that this winter could be the worst yet.

Last winter, they distributed £216,830, and 1,751 older people living on low incomes and with chronic health problems benefitted.



Ravenstonedale Parish History Group enjoys 10,000 years of horse magic

In her opening remarks of her talk to the January 2023 meeting of the Ravenstonedale Parish History Group, Libby Robinson introduced the idea of the 'horse magic' forever associated with the traditional breeders of Fell ponies, which describes their application of knowledge, passed from Father to Son and Daughter over 10,000 years of Fell Pony History.

Libby is the Founder of the Fell Pony Heritage Trust, and her talk demonstrated she is an enthusiastic and passionate advocate for the ponies and the traditions and contemporary role for these unique animals. Libby's interest began during her education in Windermere and the Fell Pony Trust was founded to recognise that to breed the true characteristics of a Fell pony, they have to be bred on the fell in Cumbria.

For a long time now Cumbrian Hill Breeders are reducing in numbers as the younger generations have moved away from the farms and show little interest in the hefted herd of breeding ponies attached to their older parents and grand-parents.

The Fell Pony Trust is a Centre in Cumbria, established in 2018 to support the Fell Pony breeders and hefted grazing herds on the Fell, with a hill farm as a hub. The objective for the Trust is to provide an insight to an interesting life and train young people about a way of life, involvement with nature, animals and our farming landscape.

The talk was structured around bringing to life for the audience, the hill bred fell pony calendar, an illustration of the activities that leads to successful breeding and husbandry. Beginning in the autumn, which Libby described as start of the Fell pony farming year. This season includes the gather of ponies, to bring the foals down from the fells for weaning. This time is when the breeders begin training of the young stock, including becoming accustomed to the head collar and other agricultural task livery, while enjoying a diet that is marginally more nutritious than the diet offered by the upper fells, where the family groups of ponies will have spent the winter. After autumn, mothers and what are termed as followers return to winter on the high fells. Followers are the female foals born in the previous year. Gelded males and ungelded males are traditionally not allowed on the fells.

During May the unaided birth of foals in the in-bye land (pastures below the high fells, around the farm), in the spring, was illustrated and the natural instincts of the mothers and brood mares in protecting and nurturing the foals, without any human intervention in the hill farm landscape was explained with many photographs and Libby's lively presentation style.

Photographs also portrayed the physical characteristics of fell ponies, including the structure of the foot, making it pivotal in the very necessary balance and carriage as each animal travels five to ten miles during a day, feeding and caring for the foals, sheltering by the dry stone walls and keeping dry and warm due to the water repellent structure of the fell ponies coat. Bringing the mares to the stallion takes place close by the farm during the end of the time when the stock are gathered, between May and early July, before the Mares return to the fells, with the foals that were born in the May.

In thanking Libby for an interesting and informative talk, the members of RPHG noted the numbers that underpinned the talk. 30 miles a day – the distance a pack horse could travel in a day, 16 stone – the weight of the pack carried, 18 hours, the time the fell ponies spend eating on the fell, and 10,000 years of hill bred fell pony history.

#### ORTON MANOR COURT

Special General Meeting duly convened and held at Orton Market Hall on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> November 2022 at 7.30pm

Present: Kyle Blue (Chairman), Wendy Higgins (Steward), Brenda Iveson (Treasurer), Christopher Jenkin (Minutes Secretary) and 23 other freeholders of Orton.

Apologies: There were four apologies for absence.

Presentation: Wendy Higgins gave a presentation outlining the history of Orton Manor Court from 1154 AD to the present day, explaining the many changes that had taken place since that time. It is now thought to be the only surviving Manor Court in the country, and she hoped those present would agree that it should continue.

Future of Orton Manor Court: Kate Blue outlined the problems incurred with OMC's ownership of land, which at present has to be vested in named individuals, present and past officers of OMC. At the last meeting of the Committee on 19.10.22, a working party had been set up (Kyle Blue, Wendy Higgins, Brenda Iveson, Ian Johnson, and Kate Blue) to explore options for a more satisfactory solution. This Working Party now presented a Resolution:

Cont/

That the Constitution of Orton Manor Court dated 15<sup>th</sup> June 1972 (as amended on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2015) shall be repealed and Orton Manor Court Community Interest Company should be incorporated and be known as Orton Manor Court CIC.

(a) The objects of the CIC shall be to carry on the following activities:


Management of land and property to provide social, recreational, educational and environmental benefits to the Parish of Orton.

Preservation, maintenance, interpretation and presentation of the historic buildings and sites of archaeological interest in the ownership of the Manor Court and the cultural heritage of the Manor Court to provide social, recreational, educational and environmental benefits to the Parish of Orton and opportunities to engage the broader community in such activities.

- (b) The CIC shall be limited by guarantee.
- (c) The CIC shall be a non-trading company.
- (d) There shall be an Asset Lock for the benefit of the community of Orton
- (e) The standard memorandum and articles for a CIC with small membership amended to include the existing provisions for meetings shall be adopted.
- (f) The first Directors shall be the Steward, the Secretary and the Treasurer.
- (g) All the assets of Orton Manor Court shall be transferred to Orton Manor Court CIC
- (h) The Directors shall be permitted to take all actions necessary to transfer the assets to Orton Manor Court CIC at such time as they consider appropriate

These special resolutions were PROPOSED by Phil Rigby, SECONDED by Jan Anning, and unanimously passed by show of hands.

It was proposed and agreed that the Working Party would set up the CIC and that the first directors shall be Wendy Higgins, Brenda Iveson and Christopher Jenkin. The existing Officers and Committee shall remain in office until the next Special General Meeting on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> February 2023.



#### Orton Christmas Tree Festival

We want to say a big Thank You to all those who helped with the Christmas Tree Festival in All Saints' Church between 10th December and 5th January.

This time there were seventeen trees, compared with thirteen in 2021; we really appreciate the creativity of the people who provided and decorated them. They all were asked to make a donation towards the cost of electricity, and most gave over and above what was requested.



Two people we also want to give particular thanks to are Julian and Susan Thorpe, who provided hard physical labour in transporting the boards on which the trees stood – they are stored in the Hearse House, so had to be collected from there, laid out on the pews ready for the trees, and then collected again at the end and returned to the Hearse House.

We have no idea how many people looked into church to see them during those four weeks – as the weather was first bitterly cold, and then almost unremittingly wet, it did not encourage people to go for a stroll around the village and pop into church! And of course there were the Farmers' Market Coffee Morning, the Christingle Service and the Carols by Candlelight service – together they must have brought several hundred people into church, and we are sure the Christmas Tree Festival made their visit even more special!

Why did we continue until January 5th, rather than a few days after Christmas? Because 5th January is the twelfth day of the Twelve Days of Christmas!

#### ORTON PARISH COUNCIL

Orton Parish Council met on 21st November 2022 and the following issues were discussed:

- 1.From time to time the Parish Council is invited to comment on planning applications for new developments. Occasionally the applications involve large agricultural buildings and these can make a significant impact on the rural environment. It was agreed that the Parish Council should have a uniform policy for commenting on such applications, in particular the colours to be used on roofing and walls. This policy will be drafted by the clerk for consideration at the January meeting to be held on 16.01.23.
- 2.A public consultation exercise was being carried out on the proposed new car park at The Mires. In total 112 survey forms have been completed and returned and 20 folk were in favour of the proposal; 15 people were in favour of having a car park, but not at this location; 72 people did not think a car park was necessary and there were 5 "don't knows".
- 3. The problem of defective footway lights was considered. Eden District Council no longer own the lights or provide new lights, although they continue to maintain some of them. It was agreed that the Parish Council would consider providing further lighting and would set aside a sum of money to meet the likely cost of this.
- 4.The councillors were most concerned about the possibility of flooding in the village. However, it was noted that the Parish Council has no statutory power or authority to work on watercourses and any action it might take would be unlawful.

#### 'Three Wise Men Bearing Gifts?'



#### TFBAY PARISH COUNCIL

Tebay Parish Council met in December and the following issues were considered -

- 1. The art work at the roundabout. This project is being sponsored by the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership. A public consultation exercise to see what sort of structure was most popular was undertaken and it was apparent that a steam engine was preferred as this will reflect the railway heritage of the village. Local artists will be asked to submit designs for approval. Planning consent may be needed.
- 2. The Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership had also sponsored the new footpath at the Recreation Ground which was commissioned by the Parish Council. The Parish Council had cleared some of the overgrown vegetation at the viewing area and are inviting people to assist with some planting to make this an attractive local feature.
- 3. The Parish Council is providing financial support for the local Warm Welcome Space project and also for the village planters to be maintained by Tebay Families Together.
- 4. New equipment is to be put in place at the Mount Pleasant play area as a result of a successful insurance claim to replace the old, vandalised, slide and play structure.
- 5. It was noted that the new footpath along the main A685 road would be finished shortly. The work has been carried out by the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority to a high standard and the path will ensure the safety of walkers and provide an attractive walk.
- 6. The Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership were working on an interpretation board to be placed near to the Cross Keys Inn to outline some of the history and local features of the area, and local walks.

## Yorkshire Dales National Park Visitor Satisfaction at an All-Time High

The Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority has released the findings of its National Park 2022 visitor survey, which is repeated every five years, showing satisfaction levels amongst people visiting the Dales at their highest since the survey began in 2002.

The survey also reveals how more people came to the National Park last year to enjoy a walk and to socialise, suggesting that reconnecting with family and friends while enjoying the landscape and scenery has been important for visitors postpandemic.

A record 96% of those surveyed said they were very satisfied with their visit to the Yorkshire Dales National Park, representing a continued year-on-ear increase in the proportion of visitors very satisfied with their visit over the past 20 years.

Recommendation levels were also high, with 94% of respondents very likely to recommend the National Park to friends and family, a high score in comparison with many national brands, and higher than the 91% scored in the 2017 survey.

Over three quarters of respondents said they felt natural beauty, scenery and views were special qualities of the Yorkshire Dales National Park. They also recognised - more than ever - the friendliness of Dales people, and Its pubs and food.

From Rev. Nelson Walina, Vicar:

26th October: Sorry to inform you about the sickness of my father-in-law, father of my wife Melina. Last Sunday evening, we learnt of his about to die in his house in a village 10km from where we are. Melina and I sent for him and he was admitted in St. Mary's hospital in Kasese. Ever since he is unable to eat, drink, sit or stand. We try give him porridge; he could take very little but today he has stopped to take anything. The doctors say, it's Higher Prostate cancer.

Now, the challenge is that our hospitals are very expensive. They tell us to go and buy medicines etc. Melina spends time day and night watching her father bedridden.

Melina and I need your prayers for our Mzee (an elder – term of respect), called Kule Nastolia.

27th October. My father in-law has been put on oxygen at 2:00am which will increase the medical bills. Continue to put us in the hands of the Almighty God.

We responded: "We would like to help with your medical costs. I have sent by Western Union 828,570 UGX. We will continue to pray"

28th October: We are so glad to receive support from you dear friends. Tomorrow we shall purchase more medicine as directed by the doctor.

1st November: Bad News!! Finally our father in-law passed on today at 1:00pm. Burial Thursday 3rd. Pray harder especially with Melina Masika, for she has spent one week in the hospital and she is going to spend another couple



of days at the funeral rites.

In the October and November Link, we reported how a young man, Bollen Mugisa, after running away from home and getting involved in crime in the city, returned to his widowed mother, who saw this as a wonderful answer to her prayers. Nelson told us "He came without many things – clothes, bedding, shoes, etc..." His widowed mother could do little to help. But an Orton lady was moved to send a gift to help this situation.)

14th November (See picture): Bollen and his mother: the Church team was handing over a gift from UK.

From Revd. Robert Zziwa: "My graduation as Bachelor of Divinity will be at the College campus in Kabale and the date will be 2nd December, 2022. Just keep me in prayer as you have always done!"

## Notes from the Herald February, 1923

Average weather except in mid February when it was stormy (rain and snow).

Orton's Wesleyan Chapel reopened on Thursday, 25th January after redecoration and new heating installed. On Saturday evening, 3rd February (wet) Orton's Wesleyans had a lecture on "The signs of the times" in the Temperance Hall. Orton's oldest resident Mr. William Wilson died suddenly on Sunday evening, 28th January after a fall in mid January. He was 86, a pillar of the parish church as bellringer, choirman and organist. He unveiled Orton's War Memorial. He was a retired slater and builder. His only brother, 82, survives him. A big funeral on Wednesday, 31st.

No lights on his bike at 10.50pm on 30th December, in Roundthwaite with 200 yards to go, Joseph Parsley was nabbed by the bobby. He was fined 7s6d in Court (now £30). Two soldiers, one born in Tebay, broke into Tebay Co-op on Saturday evening, 20th January and stole clothing. Caught and trial soon. The R.D.C. has shelved their sewer plans for Tebay as labour is far too dear now. Tebay's P.C. Casson is promoted to be Sargeant at Cleator Moor. P.C. Beck (Penrith) replaces him. Tebay Parish Council wants better services from G.P.O. and police leave to keep the Parish's fire hose at the Police Station. Tebay Co-op's manager stole its drapery last autumn and fled to Manchester. Caught and was gaoled for three months with hard labour. William Parsley married Mabel Alice Whitehead, both of Roundthwaite, at Tebay Church on 13th February.

**Ravenstonedale's** Mr. and Mrs. Edward Beck, Artlegarth, were driving to market on Monday, 15th January, laden with eggs. Descending Mally Hill the horse stumbled, the gig overturned. They suffered bruising and the eggs were smashed. The Ravenstonedale and Newbiggin on Lune Ex-Servicemens Benefit Association Whist Drive and Dance on Friday, 12th January in Ravenstonedale School raised over £16 (now £1280).

#### **Appleby Aris Society** JANUARY LECTURE

#### How to look slowly at Impressionism

Appleby Arts Society had a most enlightening talk this month by Joanne Rhymer, an Art Historian and specialist in 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> Century Art. She chose just three Impressionist paintings and invited us to look at them slowly and in great detail.

In the first, 'The Bathers at Grenouillere' (1869) by Claude Monet, we were to asked to consider the challenges facing the painter in executing this very outdoors painting. She suggested that there were, among many others, moving water, changing light, and the busy and active people enjoying their day out by the river. She asked us to engage our imagination, to be creative and conjure up what was being depicted here. Listen to the sounds in the canvas, Joanne asked of us -what can you hear? Boats bumping, birds singing and the shouts and screams of the bathers on their day out from the city were suggested. What would it feel like to breathe the air within this painting too?



This painting is in the London, and you can go online and look at it yourself and enlarge sections to see how Monet paints moving water, the many colours there, the complementary colours of blue and orange, red with green and the broad, energetic brushstrokes done by this genius. It was only recently, in the 1840s, that oil paint was available in a tube so Monet could carry his material outdoors and paint in the open air. Joanne also asked us to consider the viewpoint and placement of objects within the work. Would it be different if the jetty were further away from us or nearer? How important was it that the boats were pointing away from us and certain figures were placed where they were, and just why was the painting relatively dark at the front and brighter at the back.

With our senses all alert, we examined two other Impressionist paintings:- 'A Nymph by a stream' a nude done by Renoir in 1870, and Berthe Morisot's Girl on a Divan 1885. The latter, one of the rare women among the Impressionists was rather restricted in what subjects she could paint as she couldn't go in bars or outdoors without a chaperone. As a result her lovely paintings are more of interiors with women depicted, full of psychological depth. There is an exhibition of Morisot's work at the Dulwich Gallery in April.

#### **Covid Vaccinations update**

We are no longer giving first vaccines here at the Surgery. We have now attempted to contact all patients who are due their second vaccines. If anyone feels they may have been missed then they need to contact us urgently.

The following information is on our website:

#### **COVID** vaccination certification

We are unable to issue this certificate at the practice. Please see the <u>Gov.uk website</u> for further information. Proof of your vaccination status will be available on the **NHS app**, which is also valuable for accessing your health records and ordering repeat prescriptions. Alternatively, you can call the NHS helpline on 119 and ask for a letter to be posted to you. This must be at least 5 days after you've completed your course of the vaccine, the letter may to take up to 5 days to reach you.

#### **Shingles vaccination**

Patients become eligible for routine vaccination against shingles when they become 70 years of age and all those aged up to and including 79 years are now eligible to receive the vaccine until they become 80 years of age. Individuals who were eligible for the Shingles vaccination programme who turned 80 years during the COVID-19 pandemic and missed the opportunity to be vaccinated, either due to lockdown or because they were shielding at home and unable to attend their general practice, can continue to be vaccinated up to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2021.
