

# The Coronation, the Church, and you and me

As I wrote in *The Link* at the time of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, I am one of the small minority who still have clear memories of the last Coronation in 1953 – I actually cheered the Queen as she passed in the gold Coronation Coach, and I was sure she caught my eye!

Like many of us, after singing "God save the Queen" most of my life, I find it hard to slip naturally into "God save the King"! (I even said a prayer in church for "King George" soon after the King's Accession!)

Personally I am in favour of the Monarchy, as a valid and valuable way of having a Head of State representing our nation; but of course I fully recognise and respect alternative views. (I still ask republicans, "Who, at this time, would you prefer as Head of State – as the President of the United Kingdom, if you had to vote for one?" There is no name that immediately comes to mind!)

We have been privileged to have had our late, much loved and deeply respected Queen for 70 years; and her father, George VI, was a fine man too. But one has to admit that some previous monarchs have been pretty dubious characters. But so, of course, have the presidents of many countries, even those freely and democratically elected! No system can guarantee a wise, strong and compassionate leader and a person of integrity.

But whether the Monarchy will last to future generations or come to an end in our lifetime, this is the system we now have, for better or worse; and there is no doubt that the Coronation of a new King is a major national event, which many of us will want to celebrate.

Our two archbishops wrote to the Church and the Nation:

"The Coronation will be a historic moment in the life of our nation, a time to reflect on our history, celebrate who we are and look to our future.

At its centre is a Christian service in which His Majesty will be anointed as King.

It will be rooted in longstanding tradition and Christian symbolism.

We pray that this might be a moment for the nation and many round the world to encounter the person of Jesus Christ, the servant King, and hear **His call to each of us to serve others.**"

Some of us will have read the book "The Servant Queen, and the King she serves" – a remarkable account of the deep, personal Christian faith of Queen Elizabeth II; she frequently spoke about it in her Christmas broadcasts. To her, Jesus Christ was a guide and inspiration, and she didn't mind how often she said so!

As I look at a 1998 coin from my pocket, I see around the edge of the "Head" side the words: ELIZABETH II

D.G. REG F.D. "DG Reg" means "Deo Gratia Regina" or "Queen by the grace of God". "FD" used to be written on older coins "Fid Def", short for "Fidei Defensor" or "Defender of the Faith", a title that goes back hundreds of years (and with fairly dubious origins!) But the Queen certainly was happy to defend the Christian faith by her life and personal testimony.

King Charles III said some years ago that he would be happier, perhaps, to have the title "Defender of Faith" rather than "of THE Faith"; how confidently he would claim to be a disciple of Jesus Christ, I do not know, but he is certainly a man of profound spirituality, and in a multi-cultural nation it is not inappropriate for our Head of State to declare his deep respect for all faiths.

But I write as a believer in Jesus Christ, who was the Servant King above all others. He accepted the title "King" – even though it was given him mockingly; to Pontius Pilate, the Roman Governor, he said "My Kingdom is not of this world." And he had said to his disciples, "I have not come to be served but to serve, and to give my life..." The only crown he ever wore was a crown of thorns.

In our local neighbourhood, as all around the country, there will be celebrations of King Charles' coronation, and as well as the Big Lunch in most of our villages, our churches will mark the Sunday after the Coronation with special services, at which we will pray that our newly-crowned King will do a good job!

Do come and join us in this quieter and more thoughtful kind of celebration.





When childhood skies were endless blue Wispy clouds drew leaping hares Meadows gold with plaited corn Held us where we lay


When soft toes crimped in cooling stream Long hair trailed in willow weeds Salted lips from crinkled crisps Smiled at shrimps in cola bottles

# SUCCESSFUL SPORTING JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS for 3 LOCAL PARISH GIRLS:

On 17th March, three local parish girls, (who all went to Orton Primary School) Carley Thwaites (captain), Anna Mawson and Niamh Winder travelled with a team of 19 young people to South Africa. They represented both England and Upper Eden Lions/Lionesses in the South African Tug of War junior championships at Swellendam.

Before the competition they trained for 5 days at the V and A waterfront in Cape Town. They travelled to a town called Strand where they took part in a training camp with a junior club in the area, ending the day with a traditional meal called a 'braai' at the club house. A red open topped bus took them on a sightseeing tour and concluded with a trip up Table Mountain.

Over 800 miles were covered over the course of the trip and to end a fantastic adventure, they went on safari at Aquila game reserve where they saw some of the 'big five' wild animals.



The whole team, both boys and girls worked exceptionally hard and between them their efforts were rewarded with TWO GOLDS and ONE SILVER MEDAL! Well done Team (and our girls!)

The trip would not have been possible without the encouragement and hard work of the coaches; Joe Birch England Junior Coach and Jim Osborn and Martin Collins, South of England coaches. Thanks also go to Claire Thwaites and Jonathan Capper who supported the team and organised a great experience for everyone. Everyone is very proud of the team. They are now hoping to attend both the GENSB Tug of War 5 nations competition in Germany and the World Championships in Switzerland this summer.

### Orton Fell Farm Cluster May Update:

The Orton Fells Farm Cluster continues to grow and expand. We now have 12 members whose farms link to one another. This gives us enormous scope to develop networks of wildlife corridors across our landholdings.

Together with an RSPB ecologist, we have digitally mapped areas of biodiversity and we are now working at connecting and expanding these areas whether it is through hay meadows, tree planting, hedgerows or water courses. This enables us to layer different habitats across the landscape which we hope to be able to share with you soon. We are working closely with the National Park Farming team on their YDNP Nature Recovery Strategy and how farming plays an integral part in this.

Our members are continuing to welcome schools, colleges and groups on visits and training sessions. We also link with urban schools via FaceTime to allow pupils to see what we are getting up to on the farm and where their food comes from. It's great to open our gates and share what we're doing.

This area is well known for its calcareous grasslands and traditional hay meadows. Come and join us on a hay meadow walk with an Ecologist who will tell us why these areas are so valued and how farmers are protecting and expanding them. Saturday 1st July (National Hay Meadows Day) More details on our website.

We would very much like to involve the community in our local nature recovery plans. There are lots of ways you can get involved in learning more to help to protect our area. Ideas include wild flower identification and surveys, bird counts, plug planting, education events and tree planting. Come and join us at The George Hotel, Orton on Tuesday 2nd May at 7.30 pm. If you have any queries, would like to be involved but can't attend, please contact Kate Blue on ortonkate@outlook.com.

The Cumbria Dry Stone Walling Association have been bringing their volunteers to one of our member farms; they run courses and events. # The Story of Orton Police House and Gaol






Many people know the two buildings above as the Schoolmasters House and The Old School. It is true that they have been that, but what about before then.

On the 22nd October 1858 at the Michaelmas Quarter Session at Kendal, the Chief Constable of Cumberland and Westmorland reported that a small lockup was required at Orton. "More particularly since the commence of the new Line of Railway in the District". The Justices agreed and Richard Burn Esq. of Orton Hall advised them that he had such a house and premises that were "well adapted for the purpose".

A rent of £5 per annum was to be paid to him £3 by the resident constable and £2 by the county. The cost of converting these buildings was to be £30 but in fact they cost £45.

Plans were drawn up and the conversion was started. It is interesting to note that the masonry for the doors and windows was of red sandstone, whereas the native stone in Orton is limestone.

It seems probable that the Police Authority had lockups made to a standard pattern, and that the mason-work was carried out in Cumberland where red sandstone would be readily available.

54 years later in March 1914 it was proposed that the police station was converted into a school as "The population is now at Tebay, Orton has no crime now and the rooms are only 6 feet high" The conversion cost the District Council £120.00. There were local objections and letters were sent to the press but the plan went ahead and this therefore became Orton Infants School until it closed in 1922

Now skip forward to 1983. Brian and Audry Lord bought the premises and decided to convert it into their home. During the 1983 modernisation the masonry of the prisons cells was completely removed, and it now seems clear, in view of the weights involved, why the cells were left in place during previous conversations of the premises.

Each cell had a doorway with jambs and headstone of sandstone, and a window of the same material. What is noteworthy, however, is the size and weight of the sandstone blocks. Each piece measured some 22 inches from front to back to match the thickness of the limestone rubble wall into which they had been fitted. Each door jamb, 8 inches wide, must have weighed about 6 cwt, while the window, of some 10 inches width all round, and made in two pieces must have weighed not less than 12 cwt.

Furthermore, each window opening carried a weighty cast-iron frame which required a rebate in the stonework 1 1/2 inches wide. A prisoner at the gaol lodged in a space 8 feet each way, confronted, no doubt by a heavy oak fitted in its sandstone frame, and by a window at chest height sloping at sill and lintel so as to make hand and foot hold difficult, and overhead by a ceiling of close fitting planking bolted to the beams above, was, therefore, unlikely to entertain any hope of escape. Indeed the ceiling planking had been secured by driving securing bolts in from underneath and screwing them up, out of sight, on the top of the beam.

So what had been a house and probably a barn is back again as 2 houses.

# The Quest for the Holy Grail

## Appleby Arts Society's lecture for April was given

by Jacqui Hyman, an accredited conservator/ restorer who, through her personal conservation of the tapestries whose images she showed, was able to show a rare insight into their construction and design.

William Morris and Edward Burne-Jones are probably the two best known figures of the Pre-Raphaelite period, Morris famous today for his fabric designs, and Burne-Jones for his paintings and stained glass windows, some of which can be seen locally. They met at Oxford University and went on a walking trip to France to visit Amiens, Beauvais and Rouen cathedrals, and also Beauvais tapestry factory. On their return they devoted themselves to the world of art of the Middle Ages.

With two friends Morris formed a company, Morris, Marshall, Faulkner and Co. and opened a shop at 449 Oxford Street, London, a showroom full of his designs and fabrics. He despised all the cheap, new goods that were being produced, and believed everything should be made from natural products. He taught himself to master all the techniques such as stained glass, block printing cotton fabric, using the tapestry looms and how to produce the natural dyes based on early herbal recipes, that he used for all his fabrics.

Millionaire William Knox D'Arcy had struck gold in Australia in 1886 He returned to England and bought Stanmore Hall in Middlesex. He commissioned Morris and Co to decorate the whole house – including tapestries - for which the theme was the Knights of the Round Table and the Quest for the Holy Grail, for a fee of £3,500. The Holy Grail was the vessel that Christ drank from at the Last Supper, the Quest was a moral journey based on Christian principles.

There were 12 tapestries in total, of various sizes to suit the walls where they were to be hung. One tapestry was 2.45m high by 5m in length. Burne-Jones designed the cartoons from which the tapestries were woven on a medieval style high warp loom. The work was woven sideways on, and the weaver only sees the back as he weaves, he can't see the right side as he works. Wool and silk were used for the tapestries, the silk giving a sheen



to the work. The tapestries were worked from 1892-95.

Jacqui then showed images of the tapestries, which are breathtaking.

The picture on the left shows King Arthur, Sir Galahad and Lancelot, Gawaine and Guinevere, horses, rabbits, birds and it is possible to identify every one of the millefleur display of flowers on each panel. By great good luck, the current exhibition at Tullie House in Carlisle is 'The Legend of King Arthur: A Pre-Raphaelite Love Story'. In addition to some well-known Pre-Raphaelite art, there are two tapestries from the Stanmore Hall collection, which are exquisite.






