

Better Together: a call to care

Caring Deeply

As part of our mission statement, we have agreed as a Methodist Circuit to adopt the principle of caring deeply, one of four principles shared by Methodists, Anglicans, Salvation Army and United Reform Church here in Cumbria.

John Wesley once wrote: 'Holy solitaries' is a phrase no more consistent with the gospel than holy adulterers. The gospel of Christ knows of no religion but social; no holiness but social holiness.

For Wesley, holiness was the centre of everything he was about, it was the aim of his life. As a very basic definition, holiness is a way of being made whole by the presence of God in one's life.

But holiness was not something Wesley believed could be done alone as part of a privatised faith. He believed in the importance of those seeking holiness meeting together, and building one another up. We are to encourage each other on our journeys to holiness.

The journey of Wesley's life should also lead us to those that we live alongside, who might not attend church or chapel. There is a link to wanting the best for people — if holiness is a corporate act then it is one we want to see in the lives of those around us too.

When Christ is showing signs of the kingdom of God, He often acts to heal people or cast out demons, which in turn is a way restoring someone's humanity in the context of the society in which they lived.

Jesus would often say your sins are forgiven in these moments, which is a way of restoring someone to the state in which God intended but the world had taken away.

In the same way we are called to care deeply. We are to care deeply for those in our own congregations as we pursue holiness together, but we are also called to display Christ's vision to all those around us, those for whom holiness is not their aim or even on their radar of possibilities.



We are to do it simply as an expression of extravagant and overflowing love. We do this because God first loved us, and as we follow where God is moving, we will no doubt find God in the places which are forgotten, with the people who are disregarded, in the cultures that are frowned upon.

Holiness is gained not by aiming for personal perfection, but through willingly encountering God's world with desire to see God glorified through all creation and in all people. Holiness calls our own lives to be expanded and our understandings transformed. Holiness calls us to care deeply. May God give us strength to all live out this calling on our lives.



Beautiful Baroque Concert

On Sunday 20th August at St Oswald's Ravenstonedale we were treated to a most enjoyable afternoon of Baroque Music for Organ and Trumpet, Orchestra and Voice presented by the Wensley Camerata under the baton of Martin Budgett, Director of Music with Rebecca Howard on Lead Violin.

The Camerata is a group of exceptionally talented players drawn from both sides of the Pennines but principally Richmondshire and Cleveland.

The programme was delightful and Martin told us that the size and make-up of the orchestra was exactly the same as Bach himself would have had. Which along with the Organ and Trumpet also included Harpsichord, played by Martin, which was so beautiful to hear, Violins, Violas Cellos, Double Bass, Oboe, Recorder and Basson.

The programme was largely works by G F Handel, J S Bach and one beautiful Trumpet Concerto in D by G P Telemann. Michael played the 4 movements of this work which was a sparkling and sublime exploration of the high trumpet of the time.

We were also thrilled to have experienced the exquisite voice of Jane Burnell a Soprano from The Royal Northern College of Music and Leeds Conservatoire who is establishing a flourishing and award winning career in opera and Concert recital.

Jane delighted us with two pieces, one I personally had never heard before, but was sung sublimely and with such effortless precision as she sang the Aria "Tornami an vagheggiar" which concludes Act 1 of the opera Alicina by Handel, where she reflects upon her perception that she is loved by Ricciardo soon to be turned into an animal. Her tone is very pure and the piece suited her voice perfectly.

This was preceded in the programme by one of the most iconic works for Soprano and Trumpet, "Let the Bright Seraphim" from Handel's opera, Samson which Jane and Micheal performed from the middle and upper tiers of the 3 tier pulpit which St Oswald's is so famous for. The sound was simply angelic.

The concert opened with a beautiful and haunting rendition of Brandenberg Concerto No 2 in F which not only featured Lead Violin

(Rebecca Howard), Recorder (Karen Mountain), and Trumpet (Michael Atkinson), accompanied by the rest of the orchestra but as part of that ensemble, we were thrilled to learn that the young and exceptionally talented Daniel Fergie (Oboe), had stepped in at the last minute to assist with the concert having earlier returned from the Albert Hall, where that evening he was on TV as part of the Proms season playing Second Oboe in the National Youth Orchestra.

Other works performed were Handel's Concerto for Organ, Op4 No3, Handel's Concerto for Organ Op4 No4 and J S Bach's Gigue Fugue for Organ all played by Richard Selwyn Sharp on the recently restored Harrison and Harrison Organ. It has to be said that we were extremely grateful to have the organ in full working order, as in the days leading up to the event, the instrument needed to be repaired resulting in a large proportion of the organ being dismantled into several hundred component parts and reconstructed and retuned just in time for the concert.

The final piece was again by Handel, Suite in D HWV 341 "Water Piece". This Suite featured trumpet and oboes and demonstrated beautifully Handel's music pre-1733 when it was published by Daniel Wright Jnr of St Paul's Church Yard, London, who is acknowledged with compiling it in the format that it was performed by this wonderful group of musicians on the day.

Other performers were, Violin: Jill Russell, John Spereall, Fiona MacDonald, Rebecca Robertson, and Rosemary Priestley, Viola: George McQueen, Jacqui Seymour and Winfred McQueen, Cello: Janet Smith and Karen Mountain, Double Bass: Chris Shaw, Oboe: Nigel Atkinson and Bassoon: Jane Verity

The money that was raised from the concert was divided between St Oswald's Church which will be used for the improvement of the lighting in the church and the charity "Hope and Homes for Children"

We look forward to welcoming the Wensley Camerata once again to St Oswald's at 3pm on Sunday 10th December 2023 which I am sure will be a fabulous precursor to Christmas celebrations and highly recommendable.



Orton, Tebay and Ravenstonedale Anglican parishes are now part of a United Benefice of eight churches under the leadership of our new Priest-in-Charge, Rev. Canon Brendan Giblin. This Benefice links us with the parishes of Kirkby Stephen, Mallerstang, Brough, Stainmore and Crosby Garrett with Soulby.

Spicy Carrot & Lentil Soup

Ingredients

- 1 tbsp olive oil (for frying)
- 1 medium onion (approx. 125 g)
- 2 celery stalks
- 2 cloves garlic
- 1 heaped tsp garam masala (or other warming spice to taste)

½ tsp chilli flake or ground chilli (to taste)

5 medium carrots (approx. 450 g)

900 ml vegetable stock (4 cups)

150 g red lentils (¾ cup)

2 tbsp tomato puree

1 bunch coriander leaf (cilantro)

1 lemon – zest (and the juice, if you like)

salt and pepper (optional)

To Garnish

natural yogurt (dairy free if desired)

coriander (cilantro)

pumpkin seeds

Instructions

- Peel and dice the onion, celery, garlic and carrots. If you want a smoother soup, save time by cutting bigger chunks and blending later.
- Heat the olive oil in a saucepan or casserole. Add the chopped onion and celery. Sauté gently over a medium heat for about two minutes.
- 3. Add the garlic and continue to cook for a further three minutes, until the onion is just starting to turn golden.
- 4. Add the spices and cook gently for a further a minute or so. You want to release the flavour, but not burn the spices.
- 5. Stir in the carrots. Add the lentils, tomato puree and stock, and stir well.
- 6. Bring to a simmer. Put the lid on and turn the heat right down. Leave the soup to cook for about 30 minutes, until the lentils are mushy and the carrots soft.
- 7. Adjust the texture as you prefer. If you like your soup smoother, mash with a potato masher, or blend to the texture you want. You can add more stock or water to thin the soup if you choose.
- 8. Add the chopped coriander and lemon zest, and stir in. Season to taste.
- 9. Serve garnished with more coriander and some pumpkin seeds.



I replied with birthday wishes, and added: "Robert, this Sunday I want to speak about Psalm 133. It ends 'There the Lord commands his blessing.' If




God blesses a church, how would we know? What would happen? I want to ask people what they think, but I ask you too for your thoughts!"

He answered: My thoughts are:

- 1. If God blesses a church, we can only know this through the harmony the believers live in and that will exactly show the gift of Love as expected by our Lord Jesus Christ in John 15.
- 2. It makes the church a positive example to the world and helps draw others to the Lord.
- 3. It helps us cooperate as a body of believers as God meant us to, by giving us a foretaste of heaven.

(I quoted his words in Orton church on that Sunday! So this African minister was able to bless us in Orton!))



8th September: I'm heading to East African Revival Conference Center, Gahini, Rwanda for prayers. Keep us in prayers.

This year's conference theme is "Transformation".

Text: Romans 12:1ff: "Be transformed by the renewing of your mind." So

many speakers have challenged us on how to be transformed in all the aspects of life.

How Places Began

ORTON began as a farmstead on the hillside, which became a village. Its name is from the Old English words ofer (hillside) and tun (farm). Old English is what the Anglian settlers spoke in the 6th to 11th centuries. They had come long since from Angeln just south of Denmark. Orton's first butter record is dated 1239.

TEBAY was settled by an Anglian called Tibba, in a dry islet in the middle of swampy ground next to the Lune, seizing the gap at the north end of the Lune Gorge to control it. This era, of men's names ending in –a (as in Offa) shows him to be an early arrival. Tebay may be older than Orton. Its name means "Tibba's islet" (Old English) first recorded c1160.

RAVENSTONEDALE is Old Norse or Old English (or both) for "valley with the Ravens' Stone" Hrafn (Raven) being a personal name. Its first recorded entry is in Henry 11's time (1170+). By 1605 it was pronounced "Rissendale" and by 1655 "Russendale" which is less of a mouthful.

NEWBIGGIN ON LUNE (New village) is as old as Ravenstonedale as to its first entry, but is newer as its name tells you. Whoever owned its site built it as a venture or to house his workforce. Most of the outlying farms, e.g. Bowber Head were built in the 1570s – 1580s i.e. land shortage near the village forced them to break out new ground on the fells etc. nearby.

Orton and Tebay's outliers were mostly settled earlier than Ravenstonedale's. Orton Scales (summer grazing houses), High and Low, were there by 1256; Sunbiggin by 1310, Kelleth by the later 12th century (the name means hill with a spring), Longdale by 1178, Bousfield by 1279, Flakebridge by 1279, Raisbeck by 1310, Raisgill Hall by late 14th century. Later came Scout Green, by 1595, and Greenholme by 1770. Salterwath (there by 1667) hints at salt-runners evading the duty on salt. They used remote routes to evade the Excisemen. Tebay's Gaisgill was there by 1310, Roundthwaite by 1256 (Old Norse for Rowans Clearing). Weasdale (Valley of weasels) was settled by 1581; Adamthwaite Both these are in Ravenstonedale. A.H. Smith, "The Place Names of Source: Westmorland, 1 of 2, 1967

RAVENSTONEDALE CHURCH was rebuilt in the 18th century on the site of the previous one of c. 1200. On its north, in the churchyard, is an unusual feature, a very small monastery built in the late 12th century and rebuilt a century or so later by followers of Gilbert of Sempringham

(Lincolnshire), a son of the squire there; Gilbert was disabled bodily but alert mentally and spiritually, active in good works locally. Born c. 1083 by 1122 the Bishop of Lincoln had taken him into his staff. Gilbert was ordained in the 1120s and by 1131 was back at Sempringham as its squarson (squire and parson) where he placed seven devout young women from his parish in a house he built for them next to the church, adopting the Rule of St. Benedict for them. It grew slowly and steadily and became a separate Order in 1147 with houses in Lincolnshire and Yorkshire, 13 in all when he died, blind but alert aged 106 and was canonised (declared to be a Saint) by Pope Innocent 111 in 1202. His Day is 4th February, the day he died but was born into life in Heaven.

In Henry 11's reign (1154-1189) some followers of the Gilbertines built a cell (small house) round a cloister behind Ravenstonedale Church. It was rebuilt a century or so later. These followers were from the Gilbertine Priory of Watton in Yorkshire East Riding; Ravenstonedale's Lord of the Manor had given the manor to Watton Priory. As such it enjoyed all the Gilbertine privileges granted by popes and kings e.g. that if any murdered who fled to the church for sanctuary and rang "the holy bell" the local name for it, he was free. If a stranger came into any part of the manor he was safe from his pursuers.

The Gilbertines' cellars were used in 18th and 19th centuries for locking up any criminals till their trials came one.

From the above it is evident that you did not need to be martyred (i.e. slain) to be declared a Saint. Martyrs are, if anything, in the minority. Saints are those who have particularly "loved the Lord with all their heart, and their neighbours as themselves" as Jesus puts it.

Bruegel and the Seasons of the World

Appleby Arts Society welcomed lecturer Gavin Plumley to give their first lecture for the new term. Bruegel the Elder proved to be a very popular subject and the large audience were not disappointed.

Visual arts in the 16th century were dominated by religious paintings and courtly portraits of the wealthy. In Antwerp in the Low Countries, towards the end of the 15th century, a co-operative of artists and studios formed the Guild of St Luke to promote their work. Antwerp at this time was a bustling place, a port trading all over the world. This gave artists access to precious materials, such as lapis lazuli, only from Afghanistan.

Pieter Bruegel specialized in genre paintings populated by peasants, he aimed to show people the varied landscapes which he had seen in his travels. Being a member of St Luke's Guild had enabled him to obtain permits to travel far outside the Antwerp district, which gave him experience of the wider world. In 1565 Bruegel was commissioned by Niclaes Jonghelinck, a wealthy Antwerp patron, to paint a series of six genre paintings of the unfolding agricultural year. Probably the best wellknown of these paintings are the December-January picture, "Hunters in the Snow", August-September, "The Harvesters". Sadly the April-May panel was lost, but the remaining three are "The Return of the Herd" for October-November, "Hay Harvest" for June-July, and "The Gloomy Day" for February-March. All these paintings show working peasants performing tasks probably unknown to town dwellers, but there is also fun with general dancing and merriment! These paintings show that Bruegel was very aware of the working conditions of the man who knew what it was like to get up and go out to work hard all day, in all weathers . 1565 experienced a particularly harsh winter. This was the man that Bruegel painted in all seasons.

Breugel's art was often more highly valued by collectors than critics. Sadly Bruegel went out of fashion but his pictures can now be found all over the world.; three of "The Seasons" pictures can be seen in the Kunsthistorisches Museum, Vienna, one in The Metropolitan Museum, New York, and one in Prague.

We thanked Gavin for his excellent lecture which had been very much enjoyed. It was later suggested that the Kunsthistorisches Museum, Vienna should be their next Arts Society summer outing, so we can see their three Bruegels!

Our October lecture will be quite different, looking at the work of Cornelia Parker, one of Britain's best loved and most acclaimed contemporary artists.
