Home for Christmas

Dear Friends,

What's your favourite Christmas song? My favourite has got to be Middlesborough lad Chris Rea's 'Driving home for Christmas'. I love the sense of expectation - of heading for somewhere warm and welcoming.

Are you home for Christmas? Christmas is a time when we think about home and make plans for where we want to be (or where we do not want to be).

For us, having moved here in the spring, it will be our first Christmas here. Being a bit further away from family and friends adds an extra layer of complexity and challenge. But I am sure what people say is right, in the process of settling in, a first Christmas in a new home is a significant milestone.

'Home', I am aware, is an emotive word. We will all feel different about it. For many people, home is a sanctuary, a space of nurture, safety and love. For others, sadly, home is place of danger, somewhere to escape from. Home, of course, is not just a physical space, but some are denied even this. We know the realities of the housing crisis affecting people even in this area, the problem of homelessness in our nation, and so many people displaced abroad.

'Home' is important, and so is place -

homeland. At the moment, in the desperate suffering of so many people in Gaza we witness conflict over homelands. Homelands that are safe are longed for by both Israelis and Palestinians. The loss of life and suffering we currently witness is truly heartbreaking,

tragically leaving the prospect of safe homelands ever distant.

What has all this got to do with Christmas? Well, at Christmas we celebrate God making his home with us. As people we yearn for home, we long for the connection, comfort, and security of home. As we look on the many other war zones of the world, of which Gaza and Ukraine are near examples, we wonder how people can live in the rubble, the destruction, and frightening realities of war. A

war zone is the last place anyone would choose to live, let alone move to.

Jesus was born in a land that was occupied by a foreign power and ruled by terror. For a time Jesus, and his family, were refugees in a foreign land - an experience that no one embraces except as the only means to survive.

The good news of Christmas is that God chose to leave the comfort of his heavenly home to make his home among us. Even though this meant being born into poverty, insecurity and becoming a refugee, Jesus made his home in this world with all its glaring injustices.

Why did God do this? Jesus made his home among us so that we can find our way home; so that we can find the peace and security that we yearn for. By being born among us Jesus shows that God has not abandoned his world, but rather has embraced it.

Whatever you are doing at Christmas, wherever you will be, whoever you will be with, I pray that you may know the peace of Christ who made this world his home. This is what we will be celebrating at all our Christmas services. Everyone is most welcome. Come and discover the joy of God making his home among us.



A "Walk" from Newbiggin-on-Lune

to Ravenstonedale

The second evening talk in Ravenstonedale Parish History Group's 2023 autumn/winter season on 25th October in the Public Hall in Newbiggin, was given by Caroline Morris, a founder member of the History Group. Caroline showed old photographs from her own collection and the History Group's Parish Archives side by side with later views showing changes in the street scenes in the villages through the years.




From the first photos which showed two views of Newbiggin village from the same place but taken 100 years apart, to the final slides showing appearance of High Chapel Ravenstonedale before and after the sweeping changes made by Reverend Pool, who was the Minister there for only one year during the 1860s, there was much to see and learn. The Newbiggin Public Hall itself was built by local subscription to give the young men coming back from the First World War somewhere to socialise, and towards the end of the Second World War the Reconnaissance Corps used it as a base for their gruelling training exercises. The villagers were very kind to them, supplying them with pots of tea at the end of their long days in the field.


Some of the photographs featured well-known local "characters" from the past, including the Brunskill brothers with their penny-farthing bicycles, who were once reputed to have cycled to Liverpool from Newbiggin! Miles Shepherd stands proudly outside the "old" Black Swan in Ravenstonedale, with the sign showing that he was licensed to sell Ales, Wines and Spirits. The photograph of the demolition of this old pub before the present one was built in 1899 clearly shows how the road was even narrower than it is now on "Black Swan corner" – as Caroline said "only seven little girls wide"! The building opposite the pub was also demolished in order to widen the road as much as possible.



An enthusiastic audience of just over 50 people thoroughly enjoyed Caroline's fascinating talk, and much discussion and reminiscing took place during the refreshments afterwards.



Cumbria Winter Warmth Appeal

For thousands of older people in our county living in fuel poverty their winter preparations will be accompanied by a feeling of dread and worry over how they will keep themselves warm and safe.

Around 300 older people die in Cumbria each year simply because they cannot afford to heat their home properly. In our worst winters, this figure has risen to more than 500. Most people who suffer premature winter-related death are over 65 and 75% of these deaths are due to the impact the cold has on respiratory and circulatory conditions.

This year the situation is likely to be worse due to the continued energy crisis and the impact it is having on fuel bills this winter. It comes at a time when food prices and other household costs are also going up, leaving the vulnerable on low incomes in our county under more pressure than ever before. The annual Winter Warmth Appeal makes sure that older people who may have to choose between heating and eating, can stay warm and well throughout the colder months.

Last winter, we distributed £578,930 and 3,223 older people living on low incomes and with chronic health problems benefitted. You can read our <u>Winter Warmth Appeal Fund Report 2022-23</u> to see how generous donors like yourself helped keep vulnerable older people living in fuel poverty keep warm and healthy last winter.

Donations proved crucial for Carolyn, 79 who lives in Carlisle: "Three years ago, I had part of

lung removed my because of cancer. I do feel the cold. I can't afford to put the heating on all day, I'm always looking a t the thermostat. The grant takes the weight off your knowing mind, that someone's helping. They can't see it but yes, you are helping."



ORTON PARISH COUNCIL

The following issues were discussed at recent meetings of Orton Parish Council:

20 mph Speed Limit

A guest speaker would be invited to the January meeting of the parish council (15/01/24) to talk about the possible implementation of the 20 mph speed limit in the village. All residents would be consulted before agreeing to implement such a scheme and it would not be proceeded with unless widely supported.

Budget

The Parish Council had operated well within its budget for the year and there would be no increase in the precept requested from Westmorland and Furness Authority.

Market Hall

The Market Hall had been refurbished to a high standard and the Trustees of the Market Hall were keen to promote local events and community gatherings. Some work remained to be done before the upgrade could be completed, especially to floors, doors and to the stage. It was agreed that the Parish Council would contribute to the cost of the outstanding works in the sum of £5000.

Street Lighting

The poor condition of the street lights was noted and steps would be taken to identify a source of funding for their improvement. Discussions would be held with National Highways as they might be willing to consider enhancement of the lighting as part of the future project to work on the motorway bridges, due to start in 2026. Closure of sections of the motorway would undoubtedly cause an increase in traffic through the village.



Harry Venningthe Art of the Cartoonist

Members of Appleby Arts Society arrived at the Market Hall ready to be entertained and amused, and they were not disappointed! Our speaker was Harry Venning, who has been making people laugh for years, for example on Radio 4 with his popular 'Clare in the Community' and many publications including 25 years of cartoons for the Guardian newspaper. Harry started his working life as an actor, but found his cartoons were more productive. He was invited to produce some strip cartoons for free newspapers in Wales, only to arrive there and find they wanted 208 cartoons in 2 weeks!

It was for 'The Stage', the actors' newspaper, that Harry introduced Hamlet the Pig. Hamlet cropped up many times throughout the morning, to laughter from the appreciative audience who were invited to add their own ripostes to the many situations in which Hamlet found himself.

Is Mona Lisa famous for her enigmatic smile, because Leonardo da Vinci didn't have time to give her eyebrows? Harry then gave her several different sets of eyebrows, illustrating how quickly the famous face can be made to show

moods from happy through to very annoyed. He then went to the paper easel and illustrated a series of cartoon devices that are used as visual shorthand – hites, zites, grawlixes, plewds, quimps and of course those speed lines which so easily make cartoon characters appear to whiz by!

The word 'cartoon' comes from the Italian 'cartone' meaning a sketch on thick card, and came from the cartoons in the National Gallery. Hogarth's satirical work led eventually to the modern comic book and the political cartoon and Gillray was one of the first professional artists to use caricature portraits in his work.

There's nothing like a good laugh to cheer you up on a cold wet morning, and Arts Society members left the hall feeling grateful to Harry for lightening their day. taswestmorland.org.uk

TEBAY PARISH COUNCIL

At recent meetings of Tebay Parish Council the following issues were discussed:

1. Art Work on the Roundabout

Planning permission has been granted for the sculpture of a railway bank engine to be installed on the roundabout and the local highways authority has approved the scheme. However, it transpires that the roundabout is owned by National Highways and is part of the motorway, so their approval of the project is also required.

2. Fencing

A grant has been received to cover the cost of replacing the fencing around the Mount Pleasant play area.

3. Winter "Warm Spot"

It was agreed to make a donation towards the cost of running the winter "Warm Spot" at the Methodist Hall. This has proved to be a popular and important initiative.

4. Grass Cutting and Strimming

The contract for cutting the grass on the verges/recreation ground/roundabout was reviewed and certain areas were to be designated "No Mow May" areas to preserve wildlife during the month of May.

5. Budget

Likely expenditure for the year 2024/5 was reviewed and there would be a small increase in the amount of finance requested from the Westmorland and Furness authority to cover the increased cost of insurance, grass cutting and upkeep of the play areas, defibrillators and footway lights. The drainage of the recreation ground would be a major project for the coming year.



Growing Well stories

Growing Well is a mental health charity that supports recovery through growing and gardening activity. We are located in a new kitchen garden at Tebay Services Northbound. Here are a couple of stories of the impact that this work is having.

Growing Well Volunteer Howard Bell, from Brough, was one of the first Volunteers to seek support from Growing Well at Tebay Services since it opened in January 2023. He told his story to ITV Border reporter Kate Walby during Mental Health Awareness Week in May 2023

"In a former life I was a zoologist and scientist and like many other people here I have suffered from mental health issues, and I've gone through the usual trajectory of going through the GP, and getting lots of little pills that really didn't do a lot for me, so I came here to do something practical and worthwhile and fulfilling.

"Coming here has made quite a lot of difference. Those other things that I've talked about don't change anything structurally, whether it's talking or taking a little pill, it messes with your brain chemistry but it doesn't change your life, your life's still there.

"At Growing Well it's giving you something with purpose, something to do. It's a very, very pleasant and refreshing alternative approach to mental health because Growing Well is and will in the future save lives."

Growing Well Volunteer Sharon Rodhouse, from Clifton, near Penrith, was another of the first Volunteers to seek support from Growing Well at Tebay:

"My husband Mark died by suicide last year and it shattered my world. I used to start to just find things that would help me through a really dark period, and

this just happened to be coming up at the time and I thought, well give it ago.

The pain of losing Mark was so jagged and incomprehensible. It's all day by day but I still wake every morning and think – I have to get through another day, and how am I going to do that? And knowing that Growing Well is here for me once a week is really helpful. The people are so lovely, they are so supportive and it feels like such safe, supportive environment for that reason.

I get a huge amount from coming here. If I'm having a difficult day, being around the people, and the structure of the day is just super-helpful, I always feel better at the end of the day when I go home."


