

## Digging the Past in Ravenstonedale village – what did we discover?

The first evening talk in Ravenstonedale Parish History Group's 2023 autumn/winter season on 20th September was given by Dr Douglas Mitcham, YDNPA Community Heritage Officer, about the Digging the Past test-pitting project in Ravenstonedale village over four weekends in summer 2022. This was funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund and was one of the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership's projects aiming to discover the hidden heritage of this north-westernmost corner of the Yorkshire Dales National Park – see their website.

As some of the audience had not taken part in the project, Doug gave a brief explanation of the archaeological test-pitting method devised by Cambridge University that enables volunteers with no previous archaeological experience to investigate their local area with guidance from experienced archaeologists - in Ravenstonedale these were from the National Park and Eden Heritage, a firm from Appleby. Doug showed a diagram of how the metre square test pits were excavated in 10cm layers (spits) down to a depth of one metre if possible, or down to the natural geology beneath if that was less than а metre deep \_ in Ravenstonedale this layer is mostly boulder clay. However one of the test pits in the farmland had much good plough soil that had SO accumulated over the years that the natural layer at the bottom of the pit was more than one metre below the soil level.

Local volunteers and others from further afield dug 28 test pits, sieved earth to collect the finds and washed them, before putting them in bags labelled with the test pit and spit number where they were found. Eden Heritage made a preliminary catalogue and assessment of the finds, before they were sent to <u>archaeology.biz</u> for further specialist analysis, photography and illustrations. The final report by Martin Railton of Eden Heritage is <u>available online</u> for free.

Doug showed examples of the post-medieval finds, and photographs of some of the medieval ceramic sherds dating from as early as the 12th century, which have now been deposited at Kendal Museum. He also showed a plan of the test pits in Ravenstonedale village with its remains of crofts and tofts (cottages with small individual landholdings) on one side and a "back lane" (still in use today) parallel to the main street on the north-west side, with farmland beyond. This existing back lane is mirrored by a footpath on the other side of the main street to the south-west, which is the route of a former back lane on that side, again with farmland beyond. This layout indicates that the village was probably a planned Norman medieval settlement. Ravenstonedale is in the area of Westmorland that was not covered by the Domesday Book, so the test pits provided a random sample of finds to give further clues to the pattern of occupation over the centuries in and around the village.

Ceramics, glass, iron, copper, and animal bones were found throughout the village, although there were no medieval ceramics found in the outer areas, for example Coldbeck. Some of the 122 sherds of medieval pottery, the earliest dating from the 12th to the 14th centuries, were found near the bottom of some test pits where the soil was undisturbed since that time (i.e. with no other later finds in the same layer). A great deal of post-medieval pottery was found, dating from 17th century (slip-trailed fragments) up to and including 19th and 20th century domestic pottery pieces – plates, cups, storage pots etc discarded when they were broken.

The concentration of medieval finds at the southern end of the village offers scope for further archaeological investigations - this will of course depend on a source of funding being identified. Doug explained that the possibility of such future work shows the importance of the accurate measurements from nearby permanent features to the corners of the test pits that the volunteers took at the time. Now the pits have been fully recorded, the sieved earth replaced, and finally the turf replaced on top, it will still be possible to find the location of any of the pits again from the measurements in case further investigations are to be made.

Doug finished by stressing how grateful he was to the landowners who gave permission for the test pits on their farmland, the common land and in their gardens, and thanked the volunteers for all their efforts. In turn, the Ravenstonedale Parish History Group thanked him for a fascinating and informative talk.



## Public Notice

## Orton Parish Council

#### Carsa Brow

Following concern about the trees on and adjoining Carsa Brow the Council commissioned а tree report from an Arboricultural Consultant to assess the condition of the trees. The report was handed to the Council in June. It was noted that the Veteran Beech trees would warrant a more detailed inspection within the next 12 months to assess the best management plan in order to retain them for as long as possible.

However, of more concern were seven Ash trees that are suffering from Ash Dieback, it was reported that these trees were now in a dangerous condition and they would need to be felled within the next six months. It was also reported that a few trees needed remedial work to remove low hanging branches and deadwood.

After obtaining some quotations for the work the Council awarded the contract to one contractor.

The work is due to commence in November and the Council asks that the public take note of any restrictions that are in place at Carsa Brow for the duration of the works and to take note of any instructions from the Contractors.

## ORTON IN 1851

(Mannix's Directory of Westmorland plus bits by Jeremy Godwin)

Orton's first recorded spelling is Overton, 1239, being from the Old English words ofer and tun – "Farm on the hillside". Farm implied the nearby dwellings of the workforce i.e. village.

Orton Parish is ten miles by eight. Orton Town has about 100 houses, a market and 3 inns. It is o the junction of roads from Appleby, Kendal, Shap and Penrith.

The market dates from Edward 1's reign and the Fair (a fortnight long) from Cromwell's era at Lady Anne's request (he respected her though she detested him). He granted this in 1658 near the end of his life. By 1847 the Market Day was Friday but few came. Four Fairs continued – one began in 1840 for cattle.

The Church has four bells cast at Nottingham in 1529. Nobody had a right to any of the seats. The parish repaired all these except the Vicar's.

The 240 landowners in the parish had the right to choose the next Vicar but do so through twelve Trustees. One of the Vicars, Richard Burn J.P. was a noted local historian and wrote the standard work on J.Ps. He began here in 1736. He died in harness here in 1785.

The Wesleyans arrived with the late Mr. Stephen Brunskill, a tactful man. The Chapel, built in 1833, is about to be extended.

The Grammar School was built in 1730 and rebuilt in 1809. The leaders of Orton launched a Book Club in 1828. By 1840 it had lapsed, but has revived. (No libraries in those days).

We learnt that although it can sometimes feel a hard thing to do, talking about a worry can often be the best start to making things feel a little bit better. There are lots of people around to listen.






## Tebay News & Events



I have been reading about a community project in Leith which involved people from Leith making panels that represented their town and then sewing the panels together to make a quilt that represents their community. Alston has a similar one where each person has stitched their name onto a panel which have then been sewn together.

I have been inspired to do a similar project in Tebay. I would like to invite sewers of all ages and abilities to make a panel (or multiple panels) that represents part of our village, past or present, which will be sewn together to create a quilt of our community. Some ideas could include the railway and the village's history, the landscape and local wildlife, the people and houses, community activities and events, anything you feel represents our village. When it is finished it will be displayed for the whole village to see.

The size of the panels will be 10cm x 10cm with a seam allowance of 2cm. This means the 10 x 10 square will have a 2cm border all the way round so you will cut the fabric to be 14cm by 14cm. Please only sew in the 10 x 10 square and leave the 2cm border empty for me to use to attach the panels together to make the quilt.



This means in the diagrams shown your sewing will be in the white square and the grey part will be blank.

The panels could be bigger but will need to be in multiples of 10cm so 20cm x 30cm or 10cm x 30cm is good but 20cm x 25cm is not. If you are doing a bigger panel the seam allowance only needs to be added around the edge.

When completed please hand in your panels to The Old School by 31st march 2024 so I have time to sew them together before the finished quilt will be revealed in April.

I would love for as many people to get involved in this as possible regardless of sewing ability (glue is allowed!). Please don't feel limited to one panel, if you have multiple ideas you are more than welcome to make more than one panel. The more panels the better! We will be running afterschool sessions for the children to get involved and will offer materials and time during the warm welcome sessions for people to sew together.


## Mental Health and Wellbeing

## The Arts Society

Conceptual Artist Cornelia Parker RA, CBE

Cornelia Parker is a modern conceptual artist though she doesn't like labels. She feels passionately that art should be original, make you think and also make you laugh. Her hero is Marcel Duchamp who turned a urinal upside down and called it a fountain. She likes to re-use objects and convert them into something else - as cleverly and wittily as she can.

Appleby Arts Society had a most stimulating and joyful lecture about Cornelia from Rosalind Whyte at their October meeting. Rosalind is an experienced guide and lecturer at the Tate, Tate Modern, the Royal Academy and Greenwich's Queens House.

One example of Cornelia's work goes as follows. She gathered about a thousand objects made of silver plate from car boot sales, charity shops and from people who no longer wanted their teapot, sugar bowl, light fitting etc- unwanted objects with a history. She then got a steam roller to flatten them slowly and carefully, a piece of rather violent performance art in itself. She then arranged the transformed silver objects into thirty disc-shaped groups and suspended them by fine wires about a foot from the floor and lit them from above and below so that the shadows from the suspended silver pieces made mobile patterns everywhere. She then called the installation 'Thirty pieces of silver'. It is a beautiful, original and moving display with a title to make you think. The piece was made in 1988-9 and is owned by the Tate.

Perhaps her most famous piece was done in 1991. She acquired an old wooden shed and its contents and got the British army to blow it up - again an act of violence which seems to be her trademark as well. She then gathered the charred fragments and suspended them by fine wires simulating the original shed shape and illuminated them from the inside again making beautiful mobile shapes. This piece she called 'Cold dark matter: an exploded view' Again a title to make you think as you circulate around the thoughtful and witty display.

Just one further example is a 1997 piece she amusingly calls 'Measuring Niagara with a teaspoon'. She took a Georgian silver teaspoon and had it melted down and then drawn into a fine wire whose length was equal to the height of Niagara Falls and then displayed as a series of fine shining coils. Under Rosalind's expert guidance we saw many more examples of this remarkable woman's work many of which are in the States. She had a large retrospective exhibition at the Tate in 2022.






